A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR CHUCK

We can usually handle that without too much resistance. Other change is immediate, thrust upon us by necessity. That's what our church is facing due to the passing of our beloved Associate Pastor. It's not what we would have wanted, but it is what's before us. So I ask that all of us would pray for guidance and wisdom as we navigate through this sudden season of forced transition.

I can't thank all of the people enough who have stepped up to fill the void. Andy had his hand in so many things, and in many cases, he was the only one who knew what to do. We are learning as we go. Thanks go to Barbara Madden and her many hours working on our financials. Bills have to be paid and checks have to be written. With input and assistance from Doug Leonard and Olivia Stelter, our financial operations are one less thing I have to worry about.

Thanks go out to Sandy Vazquez, who continues to maintain and update our website. As you know, a church web page has become "the front door" of the church. It's where people first go when they consider visiting a church. Sandy has done a great job of giving them an easy-to-use and informative first impression of Walker Baptist Church. Not only that, but she gives us daily reminders and updates on social media as well, and in fact, the newsletter that this article appears in, *The Encourager*, is the product of her hard work.

That being said, I can think of no better sermon series to help get us through the shock of recent weeks than our current series, **Hold On!** From the first message, **Hold on to Hope**, to the last, coming in mid-October, **Hold on to the Right Perspective**, my prayer is that the power of God's Word found in 1 Peter will speak into our current situation and give us exactly what we need to move forward in faith.

I will follow with a sermon series on **Core Values**. The messages will focus on God's Word, Prayer, Worship, Service, Outreach, and Giving, and will provide a refresher course on what is truly important for us as a church.

With the passage of time, the weather will turn cooler and the days shorter; the leaves will change color and the earth will transition from summer to autumn. Our church will transition too. It is God's plan. He is in control.

Greetings, Walker Baptist Church Family!

Our church is in a season of deep grief following the loss of Pastor Andy Wolverton. I myself have struggled immensely with my day to day activities after losing a man that was a dear friend, trusted confidant, mentor, helper, and prayer warrior for me and my family. In reflecting on what I would write my article about, it seemed most logical that I pay tribute to our beloved Christian brother's memory.

Philippians 4:4-7 NIV says:

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

One of the great difficulties of such a sad and unexpected loss is trying to regain your spiritual footing and return your mind to a place of joy. The idea of rejoicing in trials almost seems silly, but I've rarely witnessed a better example than when Brother Andy lost his mother, Janis Wolverton, a few months ago. I spoke with him in the days following her death, and his grief of her loss was largely overshadowed by the joy he had in knowing that her suffering was over and she was with her Savior in heaven. That same perspective applies to us in the loss of Andy.


The passage goes on to remind us to be gentle to each other, and I've rarely known a gentler soul than Andy Wolverton. His kindness and compassion for those who were hurting was an example to all of us of what Jesus is like. We are reminded in an echo of Psalm 34:18 NIV that "The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit." As a church, we need to lean into these words from The Bible and be present and close to others within our congregation, our wonderful church family. We need to be thankful for the good times we had with Pastor Andy and go to God in prayer for the burden that we can't carry ourselves.

Finally, we are given a blessing and a promise: "And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." This is also my prayer to all those affected by this tragedy. Only through the faith, hope, and love that we have for God and for each other can we get through this. From my family to yours, I pray for God's peace.


