My prayer is that we can develop that "Come and See" culture and make it a natural part of who we are.

To that end, the next sermon series is "Whatever it Takes" and begins the first Sunday in June. Truthfully, some of us are actually quite comfortable with our church just the way it is. We like it small. We like it intimate. We want things to stay the same. If we dig a little deeper, however, we learn that that kind of thinking focuses only on ourselves and ignores the tremendous spiritual needs of the community around us. That kind of thinking has never been what Jesus intended for the church.

Yes, reaching the lost can be messy. It can be difficult. It can be uncomfortable. But it's what Jesus expects. Are we willing to accept our calling and develop an open-minded attitude, a willingness to do "whatever it takes" to see lost people come to know Jesus? Let's put into practice what we say we believe, and see what God can do with a willing church!

I've always heard that summertime isn't the best time to try to reach people. They're at the lake. They're on vacation. They're involved with sports. That may be true, but they also have more free time. They're more relaxed. More willing to try something new. Maybe even a little more willing to say "Yes" when you invite them to church.

As I pointed out in last Sunday's sermon, Ananias was effectively obedient because he was willing to say two things: [1] "Yes, Lord" and [2] "Brother Saul". How about you? Are you willing to say "Yes, Lord" when he asks you to do something uncomfortable? And are you able to be welcoming, loving, and gracious when someone new shows up? Those are marks of a true follower of Jesus. May they be characteristics of all of us at Walker Baptist Church.

At the end of April, I had the opportunity to preach the opening message of the evangelism-themed sermon series That All May Hear. I titled my sermon The Here and Now, and based it on Luke 10:23-42, a passage that contains the words of Jesus, The Parable of the Good Samaritan,

and the story of Martha and Mary in their home. The passage opens with a word of encouragement about how blessed the disciples are to be able to see and hear the gospel unfolding before their eyes and then gives two powerful illustrations about the importance of being present for the mission field that is in front of us while not letting ourselves get distracted by preparations, traditions, and convenience. One of the main points of my message was that we are put in this time and this place to minister to the people right in front of us. Martha, as well as the priest and the Levite in Jesus's story, were distracted by things that, while they were probably good, were not the ministries that God had put before them.

The Great Commission is a charge that is given to all Christians; we stand before God without excuse in our fulfillment of His command. Our church is doing a good job as it pertains to regional, statewide, national, and international missions. However, there is a LOT of work that needs to be done to grow our young adult, youth, and children's ministries. It's not financial needs I am speaking about so much as the need for people who are ready to get to work. We need teachers, volunteers, and others inviting families to our church, writing letters, organizing, and on and on. We are not called to do what is comfortable to us. We are not called to only be around our clique. We are called to spread the gospel to EVERYONE, and that means absolutely everyone. Please take encouragement from Paul's message in 1 Corinthians 9:24-27 NIV:

"Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize."


