We've just successfully completed presenting and overwhelmingly approving the 2026 spending plan, and I'm excited about two new items that I'd like to briefly address. The first is a paid position for an audio/visual technician in the media booth on Sunday mornings. I think we can all agree that our streaming product is sometimes good and sometimes not. We should do everything in our power to ensure that the service which we stream on Sunday mornings is the best that we can make it.

There once was a time when the front door of the church was the front door of the church. By that, I mean that a newcomer's very first exposure to church happened when they walked through the door for the first time and sat down in a worship service. That is no longer the case. These days, the front door of the church is the website, and a newcomer's first exposure to how we worship is when they sit down in the comfort and privacy of their living room and watch a service online. Imagine the frustration and the conclusions drawn when the sound quality is poor and they can't hear the music or the message.

To that end, we are seeking a part time technician to man the booth and ensure that what someone experiences at home when they tune in online matches what we experience in person in the sanctuary. We hope and pray that a positive online experience will then result in a positive in-person visit, which can then lead to new people coming to accept Christ and becoming engaged and active members of our church. Technology can be a wonderfully effective tool for the gospel, so let's do all we can to use it to grow the kingdom of God.

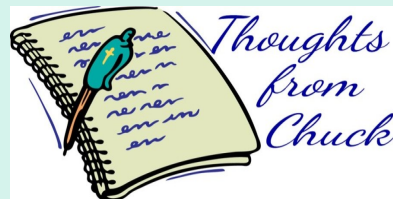
The second new item is a paid position for preschoolers and children. We're all painfully aware that we need to reach new families with younger children. If we don't, our future will remain bleak. We are seeking a part time Preschool/Children's Ministry Director who will be responsible for overseeing and managing our Sunday morning and Wednesday evening education programming (SS, missions, discipleship, music, etc.). This person will have a heart and talent for outreach, networking, marketing, and special event programming.

Think about it. If we can simply reach 3-4 new families with children each year, what a tremendous boost that would be to our church's spirit and excitement level!
