The song describes a young man’s encounter with a 102-year-old man who had been interviewed on the news. When asked what his secret to a long and happy life was, he responded, “Don’t blink.” Just like that, you move from one stage of life to another. We could apply those words of wisdom to what’s happening around our church facilities. A newly remodeled sanctuary, an updated welcome center, new carpet in the main hallways, new lighting in the front hall, a newly remodeled space for Begin Anew upstairs in the former youth room. The Eternal Perspective

"Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope." --- 1 Thessalonians 4:13 (NIV)

There is a way of thinking - a viewpoint - a lifestyle - that I am unable to comprehend, due to my upbringing and life history. It is something so foreign to me that it doesn't even make sense. And yet, for a person who holds this viewpoint, my way of thinking would most likely be totally foreign to them as well.

I am speaking of *atheism*, the belief that there is no God. By extension, many or most atheists also deny the reality of an afterlife, choosing to believe instead that a person completely ceases to exist after their physical death. This could be a strong motivation for staying alive here as long as possible and for having a fear of dying.

When I put myself in the shoes of someone who believes this way and try to see the world through those eyes, at first glance it seems cold and lifeless. It appears to be a complete denial of the very existence of spiritual realities. These realities, such as God and the movement of the Holy Spirit in peoples' lives, are all too evident to me because I have spent my entire life being made aware of them and experiencing them firsthand.

For the person without a God-centered belief system, though, I could possibly understand how a person might see the world without God if that was all they were ever taught. If they have been told from their early years that the incredibly intricate and beautiful world we live was not created by an infinitely wise and loving God but instead somehow just evolved into being. It *is* true that the everyday functions of human, animal, and plant life can at least be partially explained by science. And there are some who have tried and found that if you make an attempt to just speak to God out loud and then wait for an audible answer, you are likely to be disappointed.

That's where the miracle of *faith* comes in. When God works in the heart of an unbeliever and gives that person unseen evidence that He exists, the person is able to make a decision of his own free will to place confidence in Jesus and surrender life's control to Him. It is most often *after* a person makes the leap of faith and becomes saved that the undeniable evidences of God's presence and working become more fully known.

What are those evidences? It depends upon the person, but almost always what solidifies a new believer in his or her faith is the assurance that God lives in them through the Holy Spirit and that He communicates with them in their spirit during prayer, meditation upon Scripture, or through the process of daily living. It is daily life which usually get our attention: we recognize that a person's words, an event, the resolution of a problem, the healing of a relationship, etc. was not just a coincidence but the working of God.

Others may look at what happened and say, "Well, it would have happened that way anyway." But the believer knows that it was the subject of prayer and concern between themselves and a loving God, and the events that happened were not coincidence but rather the incredible work of God. Even mundane things can fall into this category, such "randomly" turning on a song that just happens to touch your heart where you needed encouragement. Or it may be suddenly encountering a person who says something specific to you that you really needed to hear. Most often, though, God speaks and makes Himself real to us through the regular and daily intake of His Word.



INSTRUCTIONS FOR PURCHASING FISH FRY TICKETS ONLINE

- 1) Go to the Walker web-site, www.walkerbc.org/online-giving
- 2) Choose "Click here to make donations" to enter the online giving portal.
- 3) Sign In if you have an account. If you do not have an account, follow the online directions. The system will ask for your email and credit card information later.
- 4) Under "How much would you like to give?" put the amount represented by the number of adult tickets you wish to purchase at \$15 each (ie. \$75 for 5 adult tickets). To the right of the amount space under "Fund" -- click on the words "General Fund" to get a drop-down menu. Choose "2024 Fish Fry Ticket Adult..." as the fund.
- 5) If you wish to also purchase Child Tickets (age 3-10), click "+ Another Fund" and repeat the process with multiples of \$8 per ticket -- and choose "2024 Fish Fry Ticket Child...."
- 6) Proceed with the purchase per instructions. After the purchase is completed you will be emailed a confirmation of the transaction showing the total amount. Bring a copy of that confirmation with you to the event on the 28th. If you forget, we will also have a record of this transaction here on the day of the fish fry when you arrive. Greetings, Walker Baptist Church Family!



One of my primary objectives as a father this summer has been to teach my daughters how to swim. At every available opportunity, we are at the pool working on holding our breath, moving our arms and legs, and progressively getting more and more comfortable and independent. I have been very proud of both of them and the milestones they have achieved. I have placed a strong importance on my girls learning how to swim because I don't want them to be vulnerable if they are ever in a situation that requires them to know how to do it. I also believe it is a useful skill for them to potentially help others someday.

There are major parallels that can be drawn between learning how to swim and equipping ourselves with knowledge of Scripture. 1 Timothy 4:16 NIV says:

¹⁶ Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers.

The Word of God has the power to save us from our sins, which is a truth that should ignite the same sort of passion as saving ourselves from drowning. If someone were to start saying things to you that weren't true about who God is and what He says, would you know the difference? The best preventative measure we have available to keep us from getting swept away by false doctrine is to familiarize ourselves with Scripture and practice doing what it says daily. If we are faithful in doing this in our own lives, we can be a beacon to others to lead them to Christ.

Within the next few weeks, I will be transitioning out of my role as the point person for Walker's children's ministry. It has been my passion project for several years to build our program, teach children about Jesus, and help them form relationships with Christian peers and mentors. I will still be participating on the team and helping, but stepping into more of an auxiliary position. I wanted to say a heartfelt "thank you" to the many people who have helped me during my leadership tenure through prayer, volunteering, donating, encouraging, and stepping into a variety of other roles that have helped me and the children. Our program still has a long way to go, but God has led us this far and I believe He has many more wonderful things in store for the children of Walker Baptist Church.
