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The COVID crisis has had major impacts on our local VA hospitals in Nashville and Murfreesboro. The Veterans that are hospitalized and/or living at the VA hospital in Murfreesboro have been quarantined since March 2020 and their staff has been stretched thin. All patients must remain in their rooms at all times. which means that they have been restricted from going outside, using the common areas and all visitation has ceased. A tangible drawback to the crisis

has been the drastic decrease in the number of donations. In an effort to assist them, we at Walker are partnering with the Service to the Armed Forces Division of the American Red Cross to help collect items that have been requested. Most needed are:

> Shampoo Body wash Lotion (full and travel size) Spray deodorant Laundry detergent Undershirts - all sizes Underwear – all sizes

Cards and notes of encouragement.

There will be a collection table set up in the Welcome Center on Sunday mornings. You may also bring items to the church during the week. If you prefer to make a monetary donation to purchase supplies, please label it "VA Hospital." Donations will be accepted through August 30. Earlier this month I was driving down a country road in Robertson County and passed a rural church with three yard signs mounted on the property that said, in succession, "Dig In," "Grow Up," and "Branch Out." My response was,



'There's a church that gets it.' Whether everyone in the church community lives

by those words or not, at least they're being exposed to a worthy and biblical focus. The artwork on the signs reinforced their message: seeds planted; saplings growing; and branches bearing fruit.

Think it through with me. Those three signs and the messages they bear are indeed descriptive of a healthy Christian life, and, in context, the church in its community. [1] We are to "dig in" – to plant ourselves in the Word of God and thrive in an environment that serves to nurture our relationship with God and with one another. [2] We are to "grow up" – to mature as believers by strengthening our faith and encouraging one another. [3] We are to "branch out" – to bear spiritual fruit as we make a difference in our community.

For the next two months (August & September), we'll be taking a close look at Galatians 5:22-23, that passage where Paul writes about "The Fruit of the Spirit." The series is called "A Season of Fruitfulness." It's that time of year, isn't it? Those of you who have gardens have spent months preparing the soil, planting seeds and seedlings, feeding and watering, weeding, protecting, nourishing; and now it's time to start reaping the rewards of your labors. The crops are coming in! Tomatoes, sweet corn, green beans, okra, squash, and more – and you're freezing, canning, cooking, and enjoying the fruit.

You were willing to get your hands dirty and do the hard work, because you knew about the pay off. It was worth it. The same is true when it comes to your spiritual life. God has planted His Holy Spirit into the lives of His people, and He expects us to bear spiritual fruit. Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Godly characteristics. Qualities that the world needs now, more than ever.

After weeks and weeks of being closed, churches are slowly re-opening, but people aren't coming back to in-person worship like leaders had hoped. Barna Research Group indicates that in-person gatherings are only 10-40% of what they were pre-COVID. The sad truth is, in a time when the world most needs the Gospel, it appears the least interested.


Statistics also seem to clearly indicate that the trend to stay away from church services isn't based on anything medical, but cultural. Let's face it – America is definitely in its post-Christian era. Church used to be THE gathering place in a community. Not anymore. The Bible used to be THE source for morality and ethics. Not anymore. Christianity used to be THE model of citizenship. Not anymore.

What does that mean for the local church? Do we give up? No! We take advantage of our strengths and we do what we have always done. We reach out to our neighbors and co-workers with love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, etc. We realize that the digital church is not our enemy; it is simply an effective tool that we can use to reach even more people. Every single person we want to reach is online, so let's act like that's true.

Pay attention to your online life, and make sure that your posts and messages reflect the spirit of Christ. Shower your followers with love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, etc. Hopefully, when enough of us share our "spiritual fruit" with others, the truth of Christ will slowly start to sink in! All you successful gardeners out there – what do you do when you have more coming in from your garden than you know what to do with? That's right, you start giving it away. I'm beginning to think that's what God would like for all of us to do with our spiritual fruit as well. Don't you agree?

Folks, tentatively the Fish Fry is still scheduled for <u>Sept. 26, 2020.</u> This, of course, could change at any time. Our top priority is the safety of everyone involved volunteers and attendees. A final decision on the Fish Fry will be made no later than August 26, 2020.

# IF WE PROCEED WITH THE FISH FRY AS IN PREVIOUS YEARS, PLEASE NOTE:

There would be some physical changes made in order to proceed.

There would be ample spacing of outside tables, chairs. We would do away with the two smaller tents used just for seating and replace with 3-4 tables (spacing allowed). The outside tent would be moved to a different location to prevent congestion in that area. Inside the fellowship hall, adequate spacing will be made, and plexiglass barriers placed in front of all food lines, also with extra spacing. Attendees will be directed to have spacing in line also. The cake auction would have to be moved to a different location to allow spacing...to be decided.

Unless I am notified by volunteers, I will just keep ALL volunteers in the same position as last yer. At this point, masks and gloves will be required of all volunteers. All necessary precautions will be taken to ensure the safety of everyone.

On the probability of the Fish Fry being cancelled as we know it, I do have an idea in the works. I want to keep us in the community presence. I am looking at the possibility of doing a DRIVE-THRU FISH FRY. This would probably be a **Pre-Order** event. This type of event would allow us to still have Community presence, but in a scaled down way. We would not need as many volunteers, but would increase some team numbers such as fry team, kitchen team, take-out team, ticket team. I do not have all these details finalized at August Septibles time. I am open to suggestions.




