

"Let us not give up meeting together. . . but let us encourage one another---and all the more as you see the day approaching." – Hebrews 10:25 Seasons Greetings! At this time of year, we hear that phrase wherever we go. We see it plastered on TV screens and posterized in window displays. For most Americans, it's a self-contained phrase. It's simply a November-December way of saying, "Hello, there!" It has replaced "Merry Christmas" in some circles because the latter is too exclusive and the former is a reminder to include those



who also observe Hanukkah or Kwanzaa. Now there's nothing wrong with saying, "Seasons Greetings." It's polite. It's warm. It's friendly. But it misses the point.

Back on Solid Ground

"Therefore everyone who hears these words of mine and puts them into practice is like a wise man who built his house on the rock. The rain came down, the streams rose, and the winds blew and beat against that house; yet it did not fall, because it had its foundation on the rock." – Matthew 7:24-25 (NIV)

Welcome to the world of today! Have we ever lived in a time of such craziness, injustice, and the absence of common sense? In a word...Yes. These are some chaotic times – probably the most challenging I have experienced as an adult. But those of you with longer life experience have seen conditions like these many times, haven't you? You lived through the 70's and had to deal with inflation and gas rationing and a dwindling standard of living. You lived through the 60's with its civil unrest and the beginning of our country's decade-long involvement in a war that would not be won. Many of you lived through the 50's, which, despite its growth, saw a population of people trying to ignore the possibility of nuclear Armageddon at any moment. Of course, the 40's saw the chaos and madness of war....

"There is nothing new under the sun" – except perhaps our personal experience of these events. But the events themselves are nothing new and nothing unfamiliar to a God Who knows all things and knows all of history in one effortless act. This is actually good news, because God not only knows... He has the secret to navigating this world, which often fails to reflect His majesty and wisdom. The secret lies in the effective intake and spiritual digestion of His Word, the Bible. That is how we will keep from getting carried away by life's events and once again touch our feet to solid ground.

Jesus said in the verse above that the successful person is the one who first *hears these words of Mine....* <u>Step One</u>: Find a consistent method of consuming the Word of God. Pastor Chuck recently preached about this and recommended the "YouVersion" Bible app for your smartphone or tablet. Besides containing dozens of Bible translations, this app offers several reading plans that will take you through a book of the Bible, selected passages, or the entire Bible at a measured pace. It is best to start simple. Read a chapter of Proverbs each day for a month. Read through the Gospel of John a little bit at a time until you reach the end. Set a goal you can easily finish.

But be sure not to stop at reading.... <u>Step Two</u>: Jesus also said concerning His words... *and puts them into practice.* This is where being still and listening comes into play. Sometimes we use the word meditation and may be frowned upon, but as Tim Atkinson points out so well in his book, *Unwind*, meditation is at the core of what the Bible teaches us when it comes to communicating with God. We have to *be still* if we are going to hear God's voice. And when we combine stillness of heart and mind with the intake of God's Word, the Holy Spirit applies that Word very specifically to our lives, our hearts, and our situations. We will not only find out what we need to do – we will also be given a desire to do it!

There are no really easy answers when life becomes difficult. Our bravest and wisest words become foolishness – especially to us. We find ourselves fretting and getting carried away. We don't want to act this way, but life takes hold of us, and even our prayers seem to go unheard. All one can do is grab God's Hand and cling to Him for dear life when these things happen. The whirlwind may sweep you up for a time, but if you are grounded in God's Word, regularly practicing stillness and the art of hearing from Him, your feet will eventually touch solid ground once again. Or to use Jesus' example, the house that is your life will not fall down because it has its foundation on the Rock!

What an overwhelming response we had to our call for participation in this year's Samaritan's Purse Operation Christmas Child (OCC) Shoe Box Ministry. Wally and the



fall than perhaps at any other point in my life. A few months ago, I took my daughter Helena to the Tennessee Agricultural Museum, where my wife Elaura serves as the Museum Director. They were putting on a program in conjunction with the Tennessee Division of Forestry that took kids out on a leaf hunt led by one of the foresters. At each of the six trees we learned about, the forester would stop and tell us some facts about that particular tree and let us look at its distinctive leaf design.

At one point in the program, the forester began to explain to us that the color a tree turns in the fall is actually its natural color. He talked about how the leaf was filled with chlorophyll that turned it green during the late spring and summer to help it to draw in sunlight for the process of photosynthesis, which helps the tree create its own food. The chlorophyll turns the leaf green, but the green is not its natural color, it's just the color of the leaf while it is working hard to help the rest of the tree grow and survive.

I had known about the basics of chlorophyll and photosynthesis before, but my mind had never framed it in such a way as to say that the tree's fall colors are its natural colors. I had always thought of it as a beautiful and colorful swan song when the leaves were about to die, but it changed my thought process to think of it as a leaf relaxing after a job well done. In Matthew 11:28 (NIV), Jesus says, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." We oftentimes believe that we are the ones holding our own lives together, but the reality is that everything that we have and are is from the Lord, and all of the power we are given is only through Him. He knows us, and He knows our true colors. When we rest in Him and let Him take control, He can use us for many things that are much bigger than ourselves, so that all of it points back to His glory and honor.

We are quickly approaching our Christmas program on December 19th during the church service. I'm praying it will be a real blessing to the church as we explore the humble beginnings of our Savior in a manger in Bethlehem.
