Your dream was to wake up on Christmas morning to find a stocking stuffed with goodies and a pile of presents under the tree. Those were simpler times, weren't they? Or were they?



This Christmas, as you think about "all I want for Christmas," remember that nothing in a box will satisfy what you're really longing for. The reason we keep telling the Christmas story, the story of the birth of Jesus, is because it's the only story that tells us we are loved beyond measure. It's the only story that speaks of joy, and peace, and hope. We're reminded that of all the things that we've ever wanted in this life, only Jesus can satisfy our deepest longings. I hope you'll make plans to join us this holiday season at Walker and make your Christmas wish list complete. The messages for this Advent season are:

- December 1: All I Want for Christmas Is... HOPE
- December 8: All I Want for Christmas Is... LOVE
- December 15: All I Want for Christmas Is... JOY
- December 22: All I Want for Christmas Is... PEACE

When we pull the old calendar off the wall and put up 2020, we'll start a 4-week series of messages that deals with the biggest issues of life. We all ask ourselves those deep questions. Wondering if we made the right decision, wondering if we're on the right track, wondering if there's something else we could do that would make us happier. Questions about happiness and success, about meaning and significance. Questions about what's real and what's true. Questions about right and wrong, and how we choose to live. Questions about the problems in the world, and what we think about them. Questions about God. Is God real, and if He is, is it possible to know Him? We think about death and what happens when we die. These are the human questions, questions everyone wonders about.

How we answer questions like these determines who we are at our core, what is truly important to us, and what kind of person we are. How we answer life's big questions shapes who we are, what we believe, and how we live our lives. Whether you're a Christian or not, spiritual or secular in your thinking, how you answer "the human questions" will determine the foundation of your life, and whether that foundation is solid and true. Let's wrestle with those big issues together as a church family.

- January 5: The HAPPINESS Question – "What's the Key to Happiness and Meaning in Life?"
- January 12: The GOD Question – "Is God Real and Is He Relevant?"
- January 19: The CHAOS Question – "Why Is There Evil and Suffering in this World?"
- January 26: The DEATH Question – "What Happens When We Die?"

Hopefully, we can end 2019 by focusing on the things that truly matter in our lives, things like love, joy, peace, and hope, and we can begin 2020 by building a solid foundation for doing life together as a church. God is building His kingdom, and it's a joy to be a part of His work!



WHY THE CHRISTMAS OFFERING IS NAMED FOR LOTTIE MOON

While living in China, Lottie wrote letters to the Foreign Mission Board (now the International Mission Board) and to Baptist women. She asked for more missionaries and for money to grow her work among the Chinese. Because of Lottie’s determination, WMU collected a Christmas Offering to give to the Foreign Mission Board. In 1919, Annie Armstrong suggested that the offering should be named for Lottie Moon. Today, we still give to the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering in honor of her work and sacrifice to keep our missionaries on the field.

One hundred percent of the offering goes to the missionaries, none to administration.

2020 – The Future in Focus



“For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future.” – Jeremiah 29:11 (NIV)

The ABC newsmagazine show “20/20” has been on the air since 1978, when I was ten years old. The show has often revolved around varied human interest stories and derived its name from the “20/20” measurement of visual acuity. Seeing the events of the world in clear focus seems to be a noble goal for a news show. Seeing the future clearly, though, is often an impossible goal.

For the people of God who were in exile in Babylon, Jeremiah penned an encouraging message, one which is still held onto tightly by the people of God in our day. While the words we have in the Scripture were written to a specific group of people at a specific time in history, we may carefully use the principles of sound Biblical interpretation to discern that the message in those words is one which is consistent with the whole of Scripture and applicable to Christians today. Consider these...

“The plans of the Lord stand firm forever; the purposes of His heart through all generations.” (Psalm 33:11)
“And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who are called according to His purpose.” (Romans 8:28) *“What, then, can we say in response to this? If God is for us, who can be against us?” (Romans 8:31)* *“The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.” (2 Peter 3:9)* *“May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in Him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.” (Romans 15:13)*

We could go on with nearly countless examples in God’s Word which demonstrate the principles that (1) God has a plan and is in complete control, (2) His desire is for our greatest wellbeing, and (3) He does not wish to harm us but instead longs to see us full of hope about fulfilling our purpose while we are on earth. So why don’t we experience this calming and peaceful assurance at all times?

There is no mystery about the fact that sin entered the world with Adam and Eve, when people were first given a choice to love God or themselves. Not one person (except the Lord Jesus) has made all perfect and loving choices, all the time. We are living with the fruits of sin – both our own and that of others – both recent and from generations ago –which has built up and overlapped to affect all ages of all people in all parts of the world.

That is why we need to pray and listen carefully and often to God through His Word and through the ministry of His Holy Spirit in our hearts. Those times with Him will ground our hearts and give peace to our minds as we are given light to take one step at a time in this world. Meanwhile, the One whose vision and foresight are PERFECT will plan ahead to ensure that we arrive at our destination safely and at the right time, despite the delays and roadblocks life throws our way.
