Pastor's For those of us who call middle Tennessee home and are football fans, this has been a disappointing season so far. Whether you're a Commodore fan, a Vols fan, or a Titans fan, your team has failed to live up to expectations, and the losses far outnumber the wins. In fact, as of today, their combined record is 2 wins and 8 losses. Certainly not stellar performances.

The thing is that we have to decide whether our disappointments are justified or not. Sometimes we are disappointed and we have every right to be. For example, when you're sick and you go to the doctor, you expect the doctor to be able to diagnose your sickness with a certain degree of accuracy and professionalism, and then offer sound medical advice and an effective course of treatment. If you have the flu and the doctor treats you for hives, you're going to be disappointed, and justifiably so.

Other times, our disappointments can be a mistake. This week I had to deal with a certain individual having contact with our church who expressed disappointment with one of the programs here at Walker. The root cause of her disappointment was actually a matter of unrealistic expectations. Our church had gone above and beyond what was reasonably expected, but still failed in her eyes, so she was disappointed.

How we handle life's disappointments is a true test of our character and spiritual maturity. Martin Luther King, Jr said, "We must accept finite disappointment, but never lose infinite hope." When you feel like giving up, it's because your disappointment has become larger than your hope, and that's when you lose your "first love."

Is Jesus the "first love" of our lives? Does Jesus have "first place" in everything (Colossians 1:18)? The book of Revelation contains seven letters to seven specific churches in Asia Minor, in which Jesus offers encouragement and challenge. Could Jesus still be saying this to our church? Could Jesus still be saying this to you?

I invite you to join us for a series of sermons entitled "First Love," beginning the first Sunday in October. We'll take a closer look at each of those seven churches and find ways to overcome the disappointments in our lives and re-claim that "first love."



#### **Eager to Share**

"For I know your eagerness to help, and I have been boasting about it to the Macedonians, telling them that since last year you in Achaia were ready to give; and your enthusiasm has stirred most of them to action." – 2 Corinthians 9:2 (NIV)

Everyone has something to share. It may be a talent, a financial gift, or a word of encouragement. It may be the gift of time devoted to a mundane task that others do not wish to do. It might be a musical gift that helps others to be able to worship. It might be teaching. It could be time spent with a young person to encourage him to choose the right path in life. It might be helping someone by doing a simple repair or service to her car that would otherwise be very expensive....

Or... it might be helping a church which shares its building with other ministries – to fix a drop ceiling and light fixture that had fallen, probably during one of the daily shakings from explosions at the rock quarry down the street. Did you recognize the church? That's right; it's Walker. Many of you already know about the mishap we experienced upstairs in the room adjacent to the G.A. Room. A big corner section of the ceiling fell, making the room unusable. And it *was* being used prior to this incident. My 3<sup>rd</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> Grade Sunday School Class meets in there, the deacons use it as a meeting room, and 3 times a week, Begin Anew uses it for their English and GED classes. It is a much-appreciated room.

Enter Forest Hills Baptist Church, with Bill Carden, Rodney Harris, and Jake Day. While we were investigating options to have repairs made, Angela Good, director of Begin Anew at Walker, was looking for potential workers in her pool of contacts. Her ministry brings in volunteers from many different churches in our area and touches many lives. Begin Anew ministers to nearly 60 women and has a men's ministry as well. Bill Carden's wife normally teaches in that affected classroom, and Bill is one of a group of men who go out from Forest Hills to use skills from professions they have mostly retired from to help others. Bill and Rodney showed up on Monday the 16<sup>th</sup> with tools and materials in hand to fix the ceiling. They replaced two of the lights with LED fixtures, which are bright and maintenance free. These materials were provided through Jake Day, also at Forest Hills.

A picture is worth a thousand words, so if space permits, you may see at least a tiny "before and after" shot of the room. Those of you who know me know that I like to fix things and keep them working beyond their normal service life, when possible. Sometimes replacing an object is a better option than fixing it. But sometimes replacement is too expensive. There is a special kind of frustration for a person who likes to fix things when a need or situation arises which presents a problem that is just beyond what that person can do, whether for physical reasons, lack of expertise, or lack of funds. So there is a special kind of satisfaction that comes when someone else willingly shows up and generously gives in all three of those ways in order to fix that frustrating problem.

Paul wrote that the "eagerness" and "enthusiasm" of the believers in giving help had, in the case of the Macedonians, actually *stirred most of them to action*. When we serve, when we help, and when we give to those in need, we are actually encouraging others through our actions, thus multiplying and spreading





them. Think of your life actions as pebbles thrown into a pond. You have a big impact where you are, but the ramifications of your actions expand to affect many, many others. Use your gifts and talents and be eager to share them. The blessing of God will be found in doing so.


