There are lessons to be learned and truths to be applied as we look at each of these vignettes from the very first Christmas.

The obvious conclusion is that our journey is taking us right into 2025. A brand-new year. A brand-new chapter in the story of our journey as a church. A new chapter that prayerfully will include the hiring of a new staff member, a part-time bookkeeper/administrative assistant. We're hopeful that God will lead the right person to us, and he or she will become a valuable asset to our support staff.

I spend a lot of time in prayer and study making sure that I start the year off right with my preaching plan. In 2023 we started the year with Pray. Love. Serve, immersing ourselves in a newly revised mission statement. Last year we started with The Seven Signs, where we looked at Jesus' own actions that proved who he was to the world. For 2025, I'll begin the year with a month-long series called Who Needs Church These Days? Let's face it: church isn't as popular as it was a generation ago. Today's adults don't view church as a necessary part of their journey through life. Maybe it will do us some good to figure out why that is and how we should respond.



It is not until his supernatural journey through a visit from his former partner's ghost, and seeing himself through the lens of Christmases past, present, and future that he is shocked by the realization that it is actually he who is inflicting misery on the world around him, not the other way around, and this prompts him to true repentance and sincere change. His whole life has been focused on receiving, but once his heart is softened, he sees the blessing of giving and showing love to the community around him far exceeds the company of his gold.

I encourage you this Christmas season to receive that blessing on yourself. Something that I really treasure about our church is our commitment to the cause of helping others less fortunate than ourselves. Considering that we are a relatively small congregation, we have a remarkable number of ministries dedicated to giving to others locally, statewide, nationally, and worldwide. 
