

By the time you read this, our 20th annual Fish Fry will be in the books. That singular event is always a highlight on our church calendar, and one may wonder why. Why spend so much time and energy on one thing? The answer is actually rather simple, and it's this: the Fish Fry isn't about fish. It's about so much more.

It's about connection. We get to match names and faces. Those who come to Fish Fry get to meet the Senior Pastor, the Worship Pastor, the Youth Pastor, and we often get to meet some famous and not-so-famous residents of our beautiful town. Who knows, there's probably even some networking going on!

It's about fund-raising. I list this one at the end, because I don't want us to think this is the main reason why we do what we do. To be sure, Fish Fry began as a way to pay down the debt on the mortgage on the church addition, but it has funded so much more than that. We have paid off the debt, paid for mission trips, funded community projects, renovated the sanctuary, made other building improvements, and even used some of the funds to do things like pay medical bills, rent, car repairs, groceries, and utilities.

Greetings, Walker Baptist Church Family!

The last couple of weeks have been a challenging time to be a Christian. In considering what I might write for this article, I was reminded of a sermon by an unknown pastor that my wife Elaura heard regarding the devil's desire to disrupt God's work in our lives. 2 Timothy 2:22-26 NIV says:

²² Flee the evil desires of youth and pursue righteousness, faith, love and peace, along with those who call on the Lord out of a pure heart. ²³ Don't have anything to do with foolish and stupid arguments, because you know they produce quarrels. ²⁴ And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but must be kind to everyone, able to teach, not resentful. ²⁵ Opponents must be gently instructed, in the hope that God will grant them repentance leading them to a knowledge of the truth, ²⁶ and that they will come to their senses and escape from the trap of the devil, who has taken them captive to do his will.

The essence of the sermon that my wife listened to talked about being on guard for the snares of the devil. Like an expert hunter designs traps for a specific animal's size, habits, and environment, Satan designs traps for our bodies, souls, hearts, and minds. Without the help of Jesus, we are extremely vulnerable to falling into them. However, through the power of the Holy Spirit, we can recognize these snares before we step in them, and when we deviate from the path and fall into them, He is there to free us back on our feet.

Satan has trapped and taken hold of many in this world. In the wake of Charlie Kirk's death, I have watched the vitriol hatred that many of his opponents have spewed, praising his assassination and wishing it on others like him. While I instinctively want to meet them at their level, the Bible tells me not to. It tells me to not engage with such foolishness, stupidity, and evil, as that sort of wickedness is beyond my human ability to overcome.

A trapped animal is usually scared and dangerous, even when someone tries to help it. People are much the same. Let us resist the temptation to enter the same traps of anger, hatred, and violence that have ensnared many unbelievers. We are called to boldly proclaim the gospel, but to do so with the same grace that God has shown to us. Do not lose heart, but take courage in what we still have according to 1 Corinthians 13:13 NIV:

And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.




