

"Let us not give up meeting together. . . but let us encourage one another--and all the more as you see the day approaching." – Hebrews 10:25 When I was in college, one of my favorite authors was Calvin Miller, who wrote the beloved trilogy, **The Singer**, **The Song**, and **The Finale**, beautifully-written poetic allegories of the gospel story. In **The Singer**, Miller wrote, "*Humanity is fickle. They may dress for a morning coronation and never feel the need to change clothes for an execution in the afternoon. So Triumphal Sundays and Good Fridays always fit comfortably into the same April week."* That observation has always struck me as both perceptive and condemning. The truth, when it isn't pretty, is always tough to own, yet I see the truth in Miller's statement, and I fear we as human beings haven't really changed all that much since Jesus walked this earth.

I had always thought that the swift and complete reversal of public opinion regarding Jesus, from "Praise Him!" on Palm Sunday to "Crucify Him!" on Good Friday would make for a good sermon series, and now I finally have an opportunity to see it through. Those eight days from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday were unlike any other week the world had ever known, filled with surprising twists and turns and memorable moments.

Please join us each and every service between now and Easter morning as we take a deeper look at [1] the triumphal entry, [2] the meal in the upper room, [3] Jesus' prayer for us in the garden, [4] the crucifixion, and [5] the resurrection! Don't come alone. Invite a friend who doesn't have a church home. People who don't go to church are actually more willing to attend with a friend than we think they are, if they're personally invited! Who knows – you may actually bring someone to salvation simply because you invited them to church with you!

As soon as Easter is past, Marie and I will be taking a long-awaited vacation to several European countries. We will be leaving on April 22 and will spend time in Amsterdam, London, Dublin, and Londonderry before returning home on May 7. During our absence, Wally Whidby will preach on April 27, Troy Guttormson will preach on May 4, and Bill Reitmeyer will be leading the Wednesday Bible studies on April 23 and 30 and May 7. Please keep us and them in your prayers!

On a final note, two very important children's events are on the horizon: the Easter Egg Hunt on April 12 and VBS on June 22-26. We're all aware that the greatest need we face right now as a church is to grow our children's department, and one of the best ways we can do this is by offering quality special events that show our community what a special place Walker is. We need your help. Great events don't happen in a vacuum and they don't happen overnight. Eggs and candy are being donated, and thank you for that, but we need volunteers for the egg hunt. We'll have bounce houses (thank you, Austin and Marlee Donoho!) and a petting zoo and pony rides (thank you, Kelly Lee!).

And a huge thanks to the Children's Ministry Team (and a few who aren't even on the team!) for the great pre-planning for VBS. We have made the decision to spend money from the children's budget to send out 877 postcards to all families within a 2-mile radius of our church who have children between the ages of 4-12. Pray that God will bring families with children to our VBS! Since spring is all about new growth, let's pray also for spiritual growth and church growth!

Greetings, Walker Baptist Church Family!

Recently I was watching a show about expeditions to climb Mount Everest, and I was struck by the importance of planning and preparedness in ensuring success and preventing the loss of life. Even with the best-laid plans, mountain climbing is a dangerous activity with grave potential for injury and death, but some made it exponentially more dangerous by not training properly, not hiring a Sherpa guide, not packing proper safety supplies, etc.



The parallels to the lives of Christ followers are many, and the Bible speaks clearly about preparedness in several different places, such as Luke 14:25-30 NLT, which says:

25 A large crowd was following Jesus. He turned around and said to them, 26 "If you want to be my disciple, you must, by comparison, hate everyone else—your father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters—yes, even your own life. Otherwise, you cannot be my disciple. 27 And if you do not carry your own cross and follow me, you cannot be my disciple. 28 But don't begin until you count the cost. For who would begin construction of a building without first calculating the cost to see if there is enough money to finish it? 29 Otherwise, you might complete only the foundation before running out of money, and then everyone would laugh at you. 30 They would say, 'There's the person who started that building and couldn't afford to finish it!' "

Like climbing Mount Everest, being a disciple of Jesus is hard work and requires careful preparation. We are called to love Him more than anyone or anything else we have in this world, including ourselves. Taking the daily steps of reading our Bibles, praying, attending church, repenting and turning away from sin, showing love towards others, and sharing the Gospel with others cannot be forsaken if we want to be spiritually strong enough to endure life's trials. The disciple's calling is not easy and cannot be taken lightly, but thankfully we have our Savior as our guide, Christian brothers and sisters to help us when we fall, and the faith that God gives us to keep going when things get hard.

No matter what difficulties we are experiencing, the Bible tells us that God understands and He loves and cares about us; enough so that He sent Jesus into the world to live as an example, die on the cross for our sins, and rise again to give us the hope of eternal life. Please join us at Walker Baptist Church for our upcoming Good Friday and Easter Sunday services as we celebrate the good news we have because of God's love for us!




