- Age UK Sutton is an independent local charity, working throughout the whole borough of Sutton to support older people, their families and carers. They are constantly fundraising to enable them to continue to provide vital services that enable people to make the most of their later life. Michelle pitched for money to help fund their befriending service.
- Carshalton Netball Club this community sports club provides fun netball training for women, which is great in itself, but they have also taken on a mission to make Carshalton Park better for the whole community. They want to raise £15,000 to fund the building of a new free to use, community netball court and a mixed use football and basketball court there. Mairead and Julie told us about it. - Maggie's at the Marsden this is a new centre, just built last year to provide patients at the Royal Marsden with a sanctuary, away from the clinical environment of the hospital. They aim to offer practical and emotional support to those dealing with the shock of a cancer diagnosis. Lydia, the centre's Fundraising Manager, pitched and we also heard some moving testimony from James, who has been a service user at the centre.
- Get On Downs assist and support families in Sutton in coming to terms with a Down's Syndrome diagnosis for their baby. They also run a weekly support group for these families and their young children. Lu pitched, saying they wanted to fund some 'Congratulations Packs' to give to new parents of Downs Syndrome babies at St Helier and Epsom hospitals.
