- [Project Linus UK](#) – Liz runs the South London branch of this national volunteer organisation. She pitched to help them continue with their work of organising volunteers to craft beautiful homemade patchwork quilts which are then given to sick or traumatised young people, giving them a sense of comfort and security.
- [One Step at a Time](#) – is a small local charity based in Cheam. They provide support to disabled/special needs children, and their families, by holding club days, outings, coffee mornings and more. Jo and Lorraine told us about the vital work that they do.
