Amateur Radio License Process and Study Information

The Copperas Cove Repeater Association uses the **ARRL VEC**. The Technician class is the entry-level license that requires passing a 35-question examination on radio theory, regulations, and operating practices. The current question pool expires June 30, 2026. The General class exam is 35 questions, and the Extra class exam has 50 questions. The current **ARRL** exam fee is \$15 for each exam session, so it is possible to pass the Technician, General and Amateur Extra exams during the same sitting. To find the nearest location of an exam session, go to http://www.arrl.org/find-an-amateur-radio-license-exam-session and enter your Zip Code for an exam session near you. When you find one, click on "Learn More" for session registration. Some teams offer remote testing, check with the VEC.

One of the other teams in this area uses the **W5YI VEC**, another source for taking exams, currently charging \$14 and their exam locations can be found at: https://www.w5yi.org/index.php and follow their instructions on testing.

Prior to your exam, you MUST obtain a Federal Registration Number (FRN) from the FCC:

You MUST obtain an FRN number from the FCC prior to testing for the amateur radio license. The FRN number will then be used to identify you for future upgrade exam applications and address changes. Your SSAN can no longer be used.

What to bring to an ARRL Exam Session:

- A legal Photo ID (driver's license or passport). If no photo ID is available, see the instructions on the ARRL website.
- You must have your FCC FRN number. You can no longer use your social security number.
- If upgrading to a higher-class license, your FRN will be on your license. Bring a <u>copy</u> of your current amateur radio license, or the license information printed from the FCC, ARRL or QRZ website, and that will be sent in with your exam paperwork.
- A pen and two number 2 pencils. (the pen to fill out the Form 605 and the pencils to mark the test answer sheet)
- Cash is preferred to cover the \$15.00 exam session fee.
- 1. You must sign up on (at) HamStudy.org: Log in and Register for FREE... On their site, choose the appropriate link for the exam. To take the exam there is a \$15.00 fee for adults payable to the ARRL VE Team. We collect the fee at the time of taking the exam, some of the other organizations collect the fee when you register. When signing up, "HamStudy" will issue you an identity number and send us a notification that you have registered for the exam. Additional information will be provided when you sign up.
- 2. After you pass the exam, your information will be sent to ARRL.org and the FCC.
- 3. When the application is received from the VEC and the FCC processes it, a ULS file number will be assigned, and an email will be sent directly to the applicant (you) at the email address on file.
- 3. In the email sent to each successful candidate, there will be a link with payment instructions. The VEC Team will not collect the \$35 FCC fee. You will have 10 calendar days from the date of the email to pay the FCC fee.
- 4. After the fee is paid and the FCC processes your application, the examinees will receive a second email with a link to their official license or an explanation of further action.
- 5. Any application that is dismissed will not be entitled to a refund, including vanity call sign requests where the applicant does not receive the requested call sign.
