
## Butterfly class home activities



The story for this week is Goldilocks and the Three Bears. You can find this story by clicking on the link below:

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Once you have watched the story discuss the following with your child:

- Did Goldilocks make good or bad choices when she went into the bear's house?
- How did the bears feel when Goldilocks had eaten their porridge, broken the chair and slept in their beds?
- How did Goldilocks feel when she woke up and saw the bears?
- As you talk about these emotions see if your child can remember the Makaton signing for them.



Don't forget to take photos of your child signing and send them in to us if possible.

Look at the story again and discuss the sizes of the bears with your child.







Encourage them to find things of different sizes in your home. For example, can they find socks belonging to family members that are different sizes? Once they have found some objects can they put them in order, smallest to biggest?







If you have any Duplo or building blocks, encourage your child to build towers of different sizes. Can they put these in size order from shortest to tallest? (Don't forget to send us in some photos of these)



With your child you could make some porridge at home. As you make it discuss the steps you take and the changes that you can see happening. You might like to experiment with adding different toppings; you could try jam, raisins or chocolate chips. Discuss which one your child likes best and why. Over the last few weeks your child has been learning the letter names and the sounds made by s,a,t,p,i, and n. Have a look at the pictures together and see if your child can tell you what sound each one begins with.

Look at these pictures and see if your child can point to the one that begins with n.







Can they tell you which one is t and which one is i? Are they able to write these letters? Although children usually find capital letters easier we would like them to practise the lower case letters. Click the link below to see the correct formation.
