
Ladybird Class home activities



The story for this week is The Very Hungry Caterpillar.

Can your child remember any of the foods that the caterpillar ate? Have a talk about which of the foods are healthy and which should be eaten as a special treat, and which foods they have and haven't tried before.

If possible, you could buy some of the foods that the caterpillar eats and let your child try some of them as you enjoy the book together.





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Can your child make a caterpillar or a butterfly? They could use blocks, paint, recycling or crayons.


If you have a potato masher and some red and green paint, your child could have a go at making a printed caterpillar like this.





On one of your daily walks, if you can, see if you can find a caterpillar, spot a butterfly, or even just look for some other bugs.
