A good starter idea...


Draw a dinosaur footprint on a piece of paper, cut it out to make a template, then place it on the floor and sprinkle flour, creating a footprint. You can pretend a dinosaur has been to your house to get them really interested in this week's book!

On one of your daily walks, you could find some stones and put them in some soil/sand and get your child to discover 'fossils' using an old toothbrush or paintbrush like an archaeologist.

You could follow the following recipe to make some salt-dough to make some of your own dinosaurs, and even make a swamp for them to stomp around in.

1 cup of salt; 2 cups of flour; 1 cup of water added slowly until the mixture has been kneaded into a dough.

Salt-dough can be left out to harden and then painted. It can also be baked in the oven to dry out/harden - search Google for instructions.
