Safeguarding Adults Raising a Safeguarding Concern

Course Overview

The course is aimed at learners who are working with adults who may be vulnerable to safeguarding concerns. The course covers how to safeguard and protect vulnerable adults as well as how to respond to evidence or concerns of abuse. Learners will understand the role of the responsible person and the safeguarding lead and how to manage referrals and support the safeguarding process.

Learners will gain an understanding of how to communicate effectively and work well with others, including vulnerable adults, carers, families and professionals.

Course Content

The course covers:

- Understanding what safeguarding is.
- Types of abuse including definitions and signs.
- Safeguarding policies and procedures.
- Understanding abuse and prevention.
- Adults at risk.
- Understanding information sharing, GDPR and confidentiality.
- Managing a concern or allegation.
- Understanding thresholds and using professional judgement in the decision-making process.
- Learning from Safeguarding Adult Reviews
- Understanding the legal framework.
