

Sexual Harassment and Harmful Sexual Behaviours for DSLs and Deputy DSLs

Course Overview

The course aims to inform professionals of findings and recommendations from the recent Ofsted review of sexual abuse in schools and colleges (Published 10 June 2021). The course covers training to ensure that DSLs and key staff in schools are able to address the recommendations in terms of training for staff, record keeping, dealing with disclosures and early identification and intervention.

Course Content

The course covers:

- Understanding why the review of sexual abuse in schools and colleges has taken place
- An overview of the findings and recommendations for schools
- Understanding sexual harassment and harmful sexual behaviours
- Signs and indicators of peer-on-peer sexual abuse for early identification
- Importance of the victim's voice and the rights of the child
- Handling disclosures
- Routine record-keeping and analysis of sexual harassment and sexual violence, including online, to identify patterns and intervene early to prevent abuse
- How to adopt a whole school approach
- What good practice looks like
