


## Trinket Trade Rules of Engagement!

\*Each Faire/Festival will have their own set of rules. Please check with your event to find theirs.

- Trinkets are to be given, Never Sold!
- Give without the expectation of receiving anything in return.
- No one trinket is better than another. This is for fun and to bring joy to others and a lot of trinkets are homemade.
- Do not use items vendors sell as your trinkets.
- Remember that most trinket traders are children. Get parent/guardian permission before trades happen.
- Keep trade items family and kid appropriate. No genitalia, political, religious, or other hot button items.
- If trading with a vendor, please do not interrupt sales and never ask to trade for a product they are selling. Be patient and understand they are at work.
- Please understand that while entertainers might appreciate the gifting of a trinket, trinkets can't take the place of the tips they work very hard for.
- Do not use trinkets as a business opportunity. This is not to get you more sales. It is to bring joy.
- Avoid consumables and glass. These can be hazardous.
- No advertising a new business.

## People you will most likely trade with or give to:

- Children (with permission)
- People who's outfits/costumes you like
- Workers- Very often they are busy doing their jobs and don't have the opportunity to get out to trade
- Other trinket traders- for IRFI we use Orange ribbons, but the more widely used trinket trade symbol is also accepted



All in all, be kind, have fun, don't exclude others, and remember-No one is better than anyone else.
