Faith Matters

For the past month, I have had a good time going back and forth with many of you about when the appropriate time is to decorate for Christmas. In our house, it is all I can do to hold Dan off from bringing all the Christmas decorations out of the basement before November. If he had his way, our house would be a Christmas wonderland before Halloween.

Decorating for Christmas is a big deal for many people and we are no different in church. 
Area by December 16th. I must take them to the Salvation Army on the 17th.

Turkey Noodle Dinner Dessert Recipes

Pumpkin Pie Cake recipe 1 lg. can evaporated milk

1 can pumpkin pie filling

4 eggs

1 1/2 C. sugar

2 tsp. cinnamon
1 tsp. ground ginger
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
1 pkg yellow cake mix
1 C. melted margarine
1 C. chopped walnuts

Beat evaporated milk, pumpkin, eggs and spices and pour in an ungreased cake pan. Sprinkle dry cake mix over the top, drizzle melted margarine over the cake mix, and top with nuts. Bake at 350 degrees for 60 minutes; if a knife comes out clean from the pumpkin, it's done.

| Luscious Pumpkin Dessert recipe | |

| CRUST: | |

1 1/2 C all-purpose flour

1/2 C chopped nuts

1 1/2 C sticks butter, softened

FILLING:

1 pkg (8 ounces) cream cheese, softened

1 C powdered sugar

1 carton (12 ounces) frozen whipped topping, thawed, *divided*

2 pkgs (3.4 ounces each) instant vanilla pudding

1 1/3 C milk

2 C pumpkin pie filling

1 1/2 tsp. pumpkin pie spice

Mix together crust ingredients; press into a 13 in. x 9 in. x 2 in baking dish. Bake at 350° for 20 minutes. Cool.

In a mixing bowl, beat cream cheese and powdered sugar until blended. Fold in half of the whipped topping. Spread over cooled crust. In another bowl, beat pudding mixes, milk and pie filling. Pour over cream cheese layer and spread evenly.

Mix pumpkin pie spice into remaining shipped topping; spread over filling. Store in the refrigerator. CENTRAL CHRISTIAN CHURCH
