Elders Meditation



The elders have been reading the book "A Praying Life" by Paul E. Miller and we just finished the chapter titled "Learning to be Helpless". There are times in our lives when we absolutely know we are helpless, and we don't need to learn! At those times we pray fervently from the heart.

If you listen to country music, you may be familiar with this line from "Need a Favor" by Jelly Roll – "I only talk to God when I need a favor and I only pray when I ain't got a prayer." The first time I heard that song, it really hit home.

How often do I pray when I'm not feeling helpless? I remember after 9/11, a cynical colleague said to me "well, this will be good for the churches". It was true, crowds of people flocked to churches everywhere to pray.

But the book suggests we take that kind of attitude toward other problems in our lives and the lives of those around us. We don't pray for things we think we can fix on our own. What if we realized we were helpless and came to God in prayer admitting it?


Here is a quote from the book:

"I am starting to see there is a difference between "saying prayers" and honest praying. Both can sound the same on the outside, but the former is too often motivated by a sense of obligation and guilt; whereas the latter is motivated by a conviction that I am completely helpless to "do life" on my own. Or in the case of praying for others, that I am completely helpless to help others without the grace and power of God."

It is something to think about – many helpless prayers for us all!

Church Sale


We have decided on the dates of Friday August 8th and Saturday August 9th for our annual church sale.

Recipe Shared by Konnie Carlson

Rhubarb Square Bars----Shirly Erickson

3 c. Rhubarb (if using frozen rhubarb, do not add water)

1 1/2 c white sugar

1/4 c water

2 Tbsp. cornstarch

Cook until thickened, cool and add 1 tsp vanilla

1/2 c oatmeal

1 1/2 c flour

1 c brown sugar

1 c shortening

1/2 tsp soda

1/2 c nuts

Mix as for pie crust until crumbly. Put 3/4 of this mixture into bottom of 9x13 pan. Pat down. Put filling over crust. Sprinkle remaining crumbs on top. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 30-40 minutes.
