#### Tried-and-True

I wanted a new sewing machine. There was nothing wrong with the old one. We'd spent endless hours together - my machine and I - as we pieced quilts, designed fabric collages and banners, and made dozens of tote bags. I'd never had any trouble with it, but as much as I loved that machine, it just didn't have enough "oomph" to do quilting,. So I bought a newer, more powerful machine that would get the job done.

And then, I had to learn how to quilt using a machine, so, I turned to the internet and watched videos - lots of videos - to learn this new skill.

I learned so many things. I learned how to prepare a quilt sandwich for machine quilting, how to quilt straight lines, curvy lines, and how to free motion quilt. I learned about all the tools and gadgets machine quilters needed.

And I learned that there are no rules.

Go faster. Go slower. Pin. Don't pin. Iron seams. Don't iron seams. Or "you've been ironing your seams the wrong way and here's a better way." The advice and different techniques were endless.

I've been sewing for a lot of years, and the one thing I've discovered is that there are always new ways to do things, some better than others. Something that might work well for one sewist, does not work for another. Some tools and techniques are tried-and-true, while others are not helpful at all.

I've been going to church for just as long, even longer than I've been sewing. When it comes to "doing church", some things that work well for some congregations, may not be so appealing to others. When we come to worship, there really are no hard and fast rules, if we come with open hearts to experience the presence of God alongside others who share our common desire to seek and worship God. And the funny thing is, you might read this and totally disagree with me, and you would still be doing church correctly. God meets us where we are. We might individually experience God in different ways, yet still we share in a common worship service and engage in ministry together.

We read in John that each of the disciples reacted to Jesus' empty tomb in a different way. Mary wept. "The other disciple whom Jesus loved", saw and believed. When Jesus appeared to them later that day, the disciples rejoiced. Thomas doubted. We are all so different. Each of us approaches God in our own unique way-But we are all given the same command to follow Jesus.

We are about to enter a new phase here at Central Christian. We hope to soon have an Interim Pastor to help lead and guide us as we move forward.

We are an older crowd, mostly retired folk. We aren't a wealthy church, even less so as our numbers have dwindled. We like the ways we've always done things. This is who we are. But there is more, we are called to follow Jesus. We weren't given an instruction manual. God didn't make a series of videos showing the best techniques and tools for being "church". This is something we discover together, holding onto some of the tried-and-true things we have always done, while also being open to the leading of the Spirit. God knows who we are and will lead us in ways that draw us closer to Jesus and to each other. I am looking forward to seeing the ways in which God will lead us and bless us into our future at Central Christian Church. I hope you are too!


