GA-1922 Full Communion – Not Merger RESOLUTION ON FULL

COMMUNION BETWEEN THE UNITED CHURCH OF CANADA AND THE CHRISTIAN CHURCH (DISCIPLES OF CHRIST) IN THE UNITED STATES AND CANADA

WHEREAS, Jesus prayed in his last prayer with the disciples, "that they may all be one. As you, Father, are in me and I am in you, may they also be in us, so that the world may believe that you have sent me" (John 17:21, NRSV); and

WHEREAS, the desire for the visible unity of God's one church is at the heart and commitment of the ecumenical movement, and the essence of the ecumenical movement is to seek to find unity in diversity, creating the space to engage divergences and convergences through ongoing dialogue and engagement; and

WHEREAS, the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada and The United Church of Canada affirm this biblical understanding of unity that continues to guide ecumenical commitment and engagement with other churches; and

WHEREAS, the two communions in North America envision full communion as a mutual commitment to grow together toward a vision of the church that enriches our theological traditions, enhances service and mission and deepens worship, and the two churches pledge to find diverse expressions of what it means to live in full communion in Christ as we experience life together; and

WHEREAS, the two churches understand that unity and mission are

inseparable, which is understood that Christ calls us to unite in one mission in and to a suffering and divided world, and the two communions acknowledge that we are partners together in God's mission to and for the whole world:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada, meeting in Des Moines, Iowa (July 20-24, 2019) makes the following mutual declaration with the 43rd General Council of The United Church of Canada, meeting in Oshawa, Ontario (July 21-27, 2018):

- 1. The General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada acknowledges and celebrates before God that The United Church of Canada is an authentic, faithful part of the one, universal body of 2. The General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada commits itself to work, with God's help and together with its partner churches, to effect greater unity in the whole church of Jesus.
- 3. The General Assembly of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada declares and celebrates that a relationship of full communion now exists between The United Church of Canada and the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) in the United States and Canada, by which is meant that both churches will pursue with intention ways of expressing the unity of the Church. This includes commitment to mutually recognizing ordained ministers of each partner church as truly ministers of word and sacrament, and ways of manifesting the common mission of witness and service. Old Business: Three traveling communion sets wee purchased by Robin to replace the old, worn ones. The "No Dumping" sign is on it's way to Robin and will be installed near the garage if needed. The Triumph Center has moved to its new location and the key was returned.

Security Discussion - topics included building use, the Triumph Center's move, groups using the building not feeling welcome her, and how the congregation feels.

Regarding the nesting congregation - Is this their church home, or are we just letting hem use space here? Are the expectations different for them than for "us" with regrd to church use? Board members indicated that if the calendar is open, Karen doesn't need Board approval to schedule something for the nesting group. Now is the board members' opportunity to gather information from other members about their feeling and opinions on this topic. Question of insurance coverage; it was clarified that all groups using the building are covered under our insurance. Discussed ideas to build relationships with the nesting congregation, including a shared potluck in August. The Board was

The congregation will see announcements on the screen and in the bulletin and hear an announcement/explanation Sunday, July 21.

Mission News



There are two missions that we will be collecting for in August. One is nonfood items for the House of Compassion supply closet. Their need is always great in August and there are many who are still impacted by the July 19, 2018 tornado. Please be very generous with your donations. Items needed are: Personal hygiene products such as toothpaste, toothbrushes, shampoo, body wash, bar soap, deodorant, feminine products, razors, shaving cream, toilet paper, light bulbs, laundry soap, garbage bags both large and kitchen size, cleaning products, Over the Counter medications, vitamins, bandaids, antibiotic ointment/creme, diapers, wipes, kleenex, etc.

The second mission is the "Tiger Vault" at Marshalltown Community College. Students living in student housing, and especially the international students arrive with minimal luggage. The Tiger Vault at MCC was developed and is much like the Supply Closet at the House of Compassion. Their needs are cleaning supplies, paper products and personal hygiene products. In addition, items like large trash bags, kitchen trash bags, kitchen size wastebaskets, hangars, new or gently used twin size sheets, bed pillows, towels, pots and pans and other cookware, dishes, silverware and kitchen utensils are needed. The Tiger Vault is available to all MCC students. Being able to have access to these items will help the students have a good college experience.


