# **June 2019 Board Splinters**

Robin Anctil, Board Chair, called the meeting to order and offered a prayer. The calendar check was completed.

**Property:** Bob Cook The plumber was scheduled to come on Friday, June 21 to cap the water lines to the bathroom in the old library. Bob and Mike Nablo will take out the sink and toilet.

A more secure mailbox was suggested by Jim Gossett, and he reported that two credit cards have been sent to us but not received. The concern is mail delivery on Saturday and Monday with no one at church to collect it, and the possibility that it is being taken.

Property folks are working on the dishwasher repair, and the next step is having someone check the shutoff that sometimes doesn't work, and obtain whatever replacement part(s) needed.

Mike Nablo reported that items have gone missing from the janitor's room in the basement (weed eater, extension cord) and the garage (weed sprayer, chemicals, gas can). After discussion, the property committee will explore getting a more secure door and locks for the garage, and making repairs to the door frame and threshold. Board members agreed that Mike should purchase replacements for missing items that are needed.

The locks have been changed, and no-copy keys have been made.

Mike noted that some trees need attention because of wind damage.

## **Mission News**

Since 2000, the House of Compassion has offered the community the opportunity to make a significant impact on the lives of children by providing them with backpacks and school supplies. We have been able to solicit and distribute school supplies to children ages 4 through high school. Families must qualify by meeting standards based on the current Department of Health and Human Services poverty guidelines. Families must also be registered at the House of Compassion to receive school supplies.

In 2018 we were able to provide backpacks and school supplies to 1,070 students within the Marshall County School District and we added 900 new families to our files due to the tornado.

#### Items we are collecting to give to students are:

pocket folders scissors for elementary students spiral notebooks pencils ( need about (10,000) loose leaf paper wide rule 3 ring notebooks college rule earbuds composition notebooks dry erase markers pencil boxes crayons (box of 24) colored pencils (12) count red pens large or pencil top erasers blue or black ink pens

We rely on cash contributions to make purchases of items needed and as well as buying backpacks. We hope to have another successful year and appreciate all those that help make it so.
