It is a very exciting time at Central Christian Church as our kitchen gets a makeover. Several people have been working very hard behind the scenes to make some much needed changes. Appliances had stopped working, the tile floor was coming up and overall the kitchen just needed to be refreshed with some cleaning and overhaul.

Thus, can be life. We can get caught in the same old patterns – not

paying attention to the care we need, until all the sudden, things stopping working. Self-care is an important part of Jesus’ teachings. Time after time in scripture, we find Jesus going away to be alone so he can rest or pray. Jesus knew it was important to set some healthy boundaries and we need to learn to practice this too.

April 2019 Board Splinters

Robin Anctil, Board Chair, called the meeting to order and offered a prayer. The calendar check was completed.

Property: Bob Cook

Bob has the costs to re-key all doors, and will continue with this.

The ramp floor near the east doors is often wet, Bob and Mike are working on this: caulking windows, considering repair to the bottoms of the doors, and we will continue to explore eliminating these doors, depending on fire marshall's requirement. Mike has requested to do some painting. We are waiting on more information about the roof leaks. Mike has also requested to divert water from the northwest door away from the parking lot, behind the bushes via black pipe. This is agreeable to the board.

Kitchen: Memorial money was received that will cover most, if not all, of the appliances and flooring. The board is very grateful for this Marlys Southard Memorial Gift. The vent hood exhaust does not work consistently. It is also badly in need of cleaning. At this time, in the interest of food safety, we have a bid to clean it (\$150 - \$200); repair is on hold.

Removal of old appliances: The price bid for new included removing the old. Marcia also has contacted folks locally who would remove the old appliances. The main concern is allowing time in between removal and installation to do the flooring.

The motion was made by Melia C.: That we move ahead with purchasing the new refrigerator

and stove, flooring, hood cleaning, and removal and disposal of the old appliances. Second by Carolyn T. Approved.

Purchase orders will be written for the appliances and flooring. The final choice of flooring color will be completed before board members leave this evening. Karen will contact Captain Clean to clean the range hood/vent.

Mike Nablo is doing a great job and is finding things that need to be done. He is the person who first found someone sleeping on third floor, and again on April 9. Mike is looking into ways to save money on purchasing supplies for the church. He will give Marcia something to present at the next PP&F meeting.

Building security: There has been an intruder in the building. Police have a key to the church. They will check doors and may enter as they feel necessary. Mike Nablo is the first call. Remember to check the doors when entering or leaving the building.

Old Business: Robin crafted a Security Policy and shared the draft. This was discussed and changes suggested. The policy will be shared Sunday, and copies provided to members and those who use the building. In light of the current situation, the following will occur: 1. Policy adopted by board; 2. Inform the

congregation Sunday; 3. Address concerns at the next board meeting.

Specific one-time events such as wedding and funerals will be addressed as situations arise. The motion was made by Marla C. ... "to accept and adopt the short term safety proposal with noted changes." Marcia G. seconded, motion was approved. A copy of the proposal is in the church office and will be printed in the next newsletter.

For long-term safety planning, a Safety Ministry Team will include Pastor Diana, Karen N., Jim A., Mike N., Robin A., and Jim G.

In accordance with 2016 guidelines from the Disciples Home Mission that replaces some of the language in our by-laws, the Pastoral Relations Committee will carry over with members from last year. This was approved by

the board. PRC includes 5-7 members plus Pastor Diana, with membership not determined solely by committee involvements.

New Business/Other Items:

- Honoring Karen Nablo for her work that benefits all of us
- Information about the shower project is in the Newsletter. More discussion to clarify continued, looking at different requirements and methods among Habitat, RSVP, Disciples Home Mission, Week of Compassion. There is the possibility that we will work on this independently.
- Issue of a service dog or other dog in the Triumph Center will be addressed by Pastor Diana.
- Members are asked to be quiet during the worship organ prelude and bells music out of respect to the musicians.

Security Policy

On April 11 our Church Board approved the following Security Policy for Central Christian Church. Copies were handed out in church the following Sunday. It is hoped that inclusion in this newsletter will ensure that the information is reaching everyone. Please contact a Church Board member if you have any questions!

Short-Term Solution

We need to create a safer and more secure church environment TODAY for the safety of our staff, members and invited guests. To accomplish this, effective immediately, Central Christian Church is implementing the following facility-related practices:

- We are limiting the number of doors open for public access. The south/ramp door will remain locked at all times, and anyone who wishes to enter will be required to press the doorbell/security buzzer (*even if he/she has a church key*) during church office hours. (Church Office Hours are Tuesday through Friday from 9 am to 1 pm.) In this way, the church staff will know who's in the building. At the church staff's discretion, the west/gathering area door can be locked if no one is within eyesight/earshot to monitor incoming traffic or unlocked if staff are able to monitor traffic. All other doors are to remain locked at all times unless being used as an emergency exit.

- On Sunday mornings, the south/ramp and west/gathering area doors will be open from 8:30 until 10:10 am, at which time the south/ramp door will be locked by the deacon captain. Anyone wanting access to the building after 10:10 am should use the west door, where incoming traffic can be seen by the congregation.

- Signage will be posted so that members and guests know how and when to access the building on any given day.

- A copy of this short-term proposal will be provided to all members and invited building guests (e.g. Girl Scouts, Triumph Recovery Center, Narcotics Anonymous, Nesting Congregation, etc.). The proposal will be incorporated into our Building Usage Form, and invited guests will be asked to sign a new form.

- ◆ Any members who violate this proposal will be asked to turn in their building key if they have one.

- ◆ Any invited building guests who violate this proposal will be asked to find another location for their meetings/events.

- The church will re-key the building with non-duplicatable keys. Those to be assigned keys include: all staff, Board Chair, Board Vice Chair, Treasurer, Property Committee members, Finance Committee members, Christian Education Chair, Worship Committee Chair, DWF Chair, DWF Hospitality

(funerals/weddings) Chair, and Deacon Chair. **Anyone who wants a church key can contact the Board Chair or other Board member and the Board will consider that request at its next meeting; staff members are not authorized to assign keys.** The Office Administrator will keep track of all assigned keys, and key assignments will be reviewed annually (December/ January) by the Church Board. Those who need a church key for an event (e.g. Rummage Sale, Holiday Stroll meal, youth event, facility rentals, Vacation Bible School, etc.) can check one out from the church office for a specific time period, at which time the key should be returned. There will be a \$10 security deposit for checked out keys, which will be returned when the key is returned to the office.

- Training and instructions on how to operate the buzzer/access system will be provided to any member interested. Training dates will be announced in the church newsletter.

The Church Board invites comments, questions, and suggested improvements to this proposal. All feedback will be considered at upcoming monthly Board meetings, which are open to the congregation.

Longer-Term Security Policy

As a follow-up to the Security Policy approved at the April Board meeting, a committee is being established to do some additional research and make recommendations for a more comprehensive church security policy. This is our longer-term proposal:

Online resources consistently identify a fairly standard process for developing a Church Safety Plan:

1. Develop a Safety Ministry Team – Should include staff, church leadership, and trained professionals within the membership (police/fire, EMS, military veterans)
2. Review multiple online resources and determine which additional issues and/or measure should be considered for Central Christian Church (e.g. security cameras, two-way radios, door alarms)

3. Invite discussion and feedback from church members, invited building guests, and local law enforcement professionals

4. Create a plan that addresses all relevant emergencies

5. Train and communicate on a regular, ongoing basis

6. Review/update the plan annually

Kitchen Updates

At its April meeting, the Church Board approved the purchase of a new restaurant-grade 10-burner gas stove, a new commercial-sized refrigerator, cleaning of the hood vent over the kitchen stove, and installation of new kitchen flooring. It is anticipated that all of this will be done and in place by early May.

The kitchen upgrades are being paid through a generous memorial in honor of Marlys Southard, a long-time church member and devoted DWF lady who spent many hours in that kitchen.

Additional kitchen upgrades are needed and may be considered

down the road a bit, but the Board is excited about these first important steps!

Special thanks to those who spent much time and effort researching appliances, flooring, and all the rest, particularly Bob and Marla Cook and Marcia Gossett.

Pastoral Relations Committee

The Pastoral Relations Committee (PRC) is a small group of members that meets regularly to provide support for the pastor. One of the functions of PRC is to facilitate communications between the pastor and the congregation. With that goal in mind, the PRC wants to share this information and ask for your consideration:

- It's extremely helpful to the Pastor if you make appointments to discuss specific needs or topics with her, rather than dropping in unexpectedly. Drop-in meeting requests will be accommodated as time allows, but priority will understandably be given to those with appointments.
- Drop-in traffic in the church

office is expected and welcomed, but please consider that it can sometimes present a challenge for the church staff, who have weekly To Do Lists and project deadlines. Because none of our staff are in their offices/positions 40 hours a week, they are required to be highly focused to get all of their weekly tasks done. They enjoy seeing you, they're happy to talk with you or help you, but we hope you'll remember that you are **one of many** who are in and out of the office daily.

- Pastor Diana is out of the office on a fairly regular basis for several reasons: 1) she makes hospital and home visits, 2) she represents Central Christian at local and

regional events, 3) she sometimes compensates for long days and late night meetings, 4) she works from home on occasion, and 5) she's entitled to vacation, educational, bereavement, and sick leave time.

I think it goes without saying (but I'm saying it anyway) that this congregation and its needs are of paramount importance to our wonderful church staff. We have a small but mighty group of people who do a whole lot of things (some seen and many unseen) that benefit all of us each and every day. With ongoing mutual grace and consideration, there is literally no end of amazing things that we can continue to accomplish together!
