Elders Meditation



"Turn! Turn! Turn!" was a timeless song written by Pete Seeger in 1959. Its lyrics, except for the title and the final two lines, were drawn directly from the bible in the Book of Ecclesiastes, specifically the first eight verses of the third chapter. The song was originally released in 1962, it gained international fame when the American folk-rock group "The Byrd's" adapted it in late 1965.

When we read the lyrics from the song, the words present a profound message that there is a time and purpose for everything under heaven. The verses cover a wide range of human experiences, from birth and death to planting and harvesting, from sorrow and mourning to dancing and laughter. The song encapsulates the cyclical nature of life, emphasizing that each phase has its place and significance. The closing line, "a time for peace, I swear it's not too late," serves as a plea for world peace.

In Ecclesiastes 3, Solomon reminds us that there is a season for everything; we will experience both good and bad. In verses 2-8, he lists things that contrast each other-

a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; 3 a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; 4 a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; 5 a time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; 6 a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away; 7 a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to hate; a time to speak; 8 a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace.


Soloman's point in this section is that God has a plan for all people. God provides cycles of life, each with its work for us to do. Although we may face problems that seem to contradict God's plan, these should not be barriers to believing in God, instead they should be viewed as opportunities to discover that, without God, life's problems have no lasting solutions.

The secret to peace with God is to discover, accept, and appreciate God's perfect timing. The danger is to doubt or resent. This can lead to despair, rebellion, or moving ahead without his advice. It is no wonder that we see so much despair and unsettledness in our world today. We need to preach the good news that God is here to help us get through the good times, the tough times and all the stuff in the middle. God really loves each of us and wants us to look to him daily for instruction on how to walk with him.

I pray that when you go through the seasons of life, you will look to God and look for God's direction. It is in being still that we hear God. It is through walking in our own joy and pain that we discover that only God can give each one of us a roadmap for going through these challenges that are present in our lives.




Acts 2:1-4
