October 2019 Board Splinters

Robin Anctil, Board Chair, called the meeting to order and gave the opening prayer. Twelve people were in attendance. The calendar check was completed and the minutes from the September meeting were approved.

Property: Bob Cook Has a recommendation for new projectors from the Orpheum AV person (Nate) would meet or exceed what we have, with a 3 year warranty, exceedingly long lasting bulbs, with correct "throw" and "lumens" for our needs. Cost would be about \$2190.00 each, funding is available in existing accounts. We will not purchase extended warranty. Jim Gossett: moved to order new projectors using existing funds. Robin Anctil: seconded motion, motion passed.

Personnel: Marcia Gossett and Pat Sommerlot reported that they have reviewed staff hours and salary recommendations for next year.

Finance/Treasurer: Jim Gossett Reviewed balance sheet, and although giving is below projections, things are better than they look.

Missions: Judy Osgood reported that we will collect mittens for elementary schools through November 10th. Reconciliation special offering is about \$300.00.

Deacons: Carolyn Thompson No Report.

Worship: Robin Anctil No Report.

Christian Ed: Melia Chapman No Report.

Elders: Jim Anctil No Report.

Congregational Representatives:

Marla Cook and Carolyn Thompson there were questions about communion being offered Sunday, October 20 when the safety presentation will take place. Communion will be available in the gathering area, along with offering plates. Also shared comments from some folks in the congregation asking that they receive more information about the times when Pastor Diana is gone, (for example, when it is for coursework a brief mention of topic.)

DWF: Sarah Sade (via written report) Group Lydia served 26 at the DWF Fall dinner meeting. The program was on horses being used for therapy for children who are still suffering from anxiety caused by the 2018 tornado. 14 boxes of Kleenex and 86 pairs of underwear were distributed to our area elementary schools. 7 cards were sent and one funeral served. We have started this year's study called: "It's Not Supposed to Be This Way" by Lysa Terkeurst. We have a CD, lesson workbook and her book to use as we study her message.

Pastor's Report: Diana

October 20 is safety Sunday. There will be Prayer and the presentation, but no other "regular" activities. Karen will remind folks again. Pledge forms will be out for a few more weeks. Diana noted that she along with Elders and PRC are beginning some activities regarding visioning for our church and congregation. This will include a book study.

Old Business:

Nominating: The ballot is filled, and there will be three additional visitation elders. Many thanks to

the nominating committee for their work.

Budget: requests are still needed from some committees. Known change at this time is for the Worship committee. The Finance Committee will meet and have a budget ready to present to the board November 21, and then the congregation during the annual meeting.

Tornado: There have been some calls about insurance relating to tornado damage. Jim Anctil has talked to Steve Huseboe who will gather receipts and talk to the insurance company. The steeple is closer to finished - the copper is on, seams are being sealed before it can be re-installed.

New Business/Other Items:

Beth Campbell - turned in a fund-raising form for the Turkey Noodle Dinner to take place on November 23, Holiday Stroll night. Ramona Osgood and Beth Campbell will organize. Thanks to a member of our congregation, almost all the food is donated for this event. Designation for the proceeds will be determined. Robin Anctil moved to approve the request for fundraising. Carolyn Thompson seconded the motion, it was approved by the board.

Jim Gossett discussed vacation and holiday pay policy for the office manager, and presented a statement clarifying this. It has been approved by the Personnel, Property and Finance Committee.

Jim Gossett made a motion to accept the policy.

Judy Osgood seconded the motion, the board approved this motion.

Celebration of Life



The smile and musical talents of Max Graves, age 85, of Marshalltown, are now gracing Heaven's halls. He left this earthly life with his family at his side under the care of the Iowa River Hospice home on Tuesday, October 8th.

A Celebration of Life was held on Saturday, October 12th, at the Central Christian Church with Pastor Loren Strait officiating. He was laid to rest in the Riverside Cemetery with full military honors by the Combined American Legion and VFW Posts in the Marshalltown area.

Born on December 3rd, 1933, in Davis City, Iowa, he was the middle child of five born to James Orville and Helene (Fetty) Graves. He graduated from the Webster City High School in 1952 and soon enlisted in the US Army.

Max served our country honorably during the Korean War for two years and returned to Iowa to begin schooling at AIB in Des Moines.

Walking into school one day with his friends, he caught the eye of a young Janet Galloway, who at that moment told her friends "I am going to marry that boy!" 

Safety Sunday Update

- I was not taking notes during October 20th's "Safety Sunday." In fact, I probably had a bug-eyed expression on my face during most of it. Officer Chad Hillers was an authoritative presenter, and the videos and information he shared made a big impact on me ... and on many of you, from the comments I heard afterward. For those who were unable to attend, I thought I would try and capture a few key points:
- The majority of Violent Incidents in the U.S. are over in 2-5 minutes (often even before police can arrive on the scene). This is why it's so important to learn ahead of time what might happen and the options that innocent bystanders can consider in such a situation.
- The ALICE training program urges people to take these steps during violent incidents, as best they can:

- O ALERT -- Call 9-1-1 as soon as possible.
- o LOCK DOWN -- If a violent intruder is nearby, find a way to safely barricade and protect yourself. Hiding under a table won't be nearly as safe as moving the table in front of a door so it can't be as easily opened (for example).
- o INFORM -- If you are able, alert others nearby so that they can flee or find safety.
- o COUNTER -- If confronted directly, think about nearby objects that could be used to throw at or strike the intruder. If you're in a group, spread out so that it will be harder for the intruder to hurt large numbers of people easily.
- o EVACUATE -- If there's any way to get out of the room, building or area under attack, do that. Take your cell phone, but don't worry about other possessions. You can retrieve those later.

To break a window, hit the corners of the window rather than the center. Find some solid object to run around the edges of the broken window to minimize cuts before you or others climb out.

Our Church Safety Team will be following up to this training with some specific information for church members about our building, exits, and suggestions for surviving a violent attack in our church. Watch a future newsletter for this and other safety-related information.

If there is sufficient interest, additional safety training may be offered in a group setting, but it would not be during the regular worship service time.


