Pastor's Ponderings October 2023

"²⁴ And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵ not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another..." Hebrews 10: 24-25a (NRSV) "¹¹The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, ¹²to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, ¹³until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ. ... ¹⁵But speaking the truth in love, we must grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, ¹⁶from whom the whole body, joined and knitted together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love." Ephesians 4: 11-16 (NRSV)

Can you believe it's fall already? Where did our summer go? It feels like our year is flying past and before we know it, it will be All Hallows Eve, Thanksgiving, Christmas, and then we'll be ringing in 2024! Mercy. A lot has happened, and quickly it seems, this year.

On the world stage, Russia is still in Ukraine; tornadoes, fires, and floods continue to displace so many; desperate people are still showing up by the thousands seeking asylum in our great nation; picketers are still picketing; and politicians are still, well, politicking. Truly, it seems, nothing is new under the sun.

I electronically met a person the other day. Part of my ministry is online, so it doesn't surprise me when new opportunities arise to tell of the Love, forgiveness, and mercy of God online. However, this time I think I am the one who may grow from the encounter, as this person has shared all of the horrific things done to them throughout the years, and yet, they continue to pursue something full of grace, something higher and more full of Light than what was presented to them as "God" for so, so much of their lives.

Why does that have an opportunity to teach me? Because this person's conception of Love is found in spiritual practices that I have not experienced before. As we've conversed, I recognize God's Light, though, shining through this new-to-me encounter, and so, with prayer and eyes wide open, I allow my curiosity to ask questions and ponder the places our almighty God occupies that I've not even plumbed yet.

It occurs to me that our churches are similar to me. We know God exists; we testify to a loving, grace-filled Creator, and yet, we tend to not want to open ourselves up to anything new for fear of....losing our hold on what we do know? ...sinking into the stormy seas? ...afraid we'll get it wrong and be punished? (I don't know. What would you answer here?) And so, we doggedly insist on doing things the same old way, year in and year out, and then wonder aloud why no one new is stepping up to help out; why our spiritual life seems...dry, dusty, and one-dimensional at best. Reminds me of some scripture:

"³ Then the Lord said to me, "Son of man, ^[c] can these bones come to life?" I answered, "Lord God, only you know the answer to that question." ⁴ Then he said to me, "Speak to these bones for me. Tell them, 'Dry bones, listen to the word of the Lord! ⁵ This is what the Lord God says to you: I will cause breath ^[d] to come into you, and you will come to life! ⁶ I will put sinew and muscles on you, and I will cover you with skin. Then I will put breath in you, and you will come back to life! Then you will know that I am the Lord."

⁷ So I spoke to the bones for the LORD, as he said. I was still speaking, when I heard the loud noise. The bones began to rattle, and bone joined together with bone! ⁸ There before my eyes, I saw sinew and muscles begin to cover the bones. Skin began to cover them, but there was no breath in them.

⁹ Then the Lord said to me, "Speak to the wind [g] for me. Son of man, speak to the wind for me. Tell the wind that this is what the Lord God says: 'Wind, come from every direction and breathe air into these dead bodies! Breathe into them and they will come to life again!"

¹⁰ So I spoke to the wind for the LORD, as he said, and the breath came into the dead bodies. They came to life and stood up." Ezekiel 37: 1-10, ERV

I've been thinking about all of the things Central Christian *could* be doing, but we *aren't*. For example, we *could* offer free, community meals... but we don't. We *could* offer an after-school program... but we don't. We *could* have a moms' group...or a singles' group...or a couples' group...or an AA or NA or counseling services in our building... but we don't. We *could* have a Children's Moment or a Stephen's Ministry or a housing program for new immigrants... but we don't. We *could* have an active spirituality group...but we don't (we do have 3 awesome members regularly attend our prayer group, though, and we'd so love to have more of you there!). Any other ideas floating out there? What's YOUR idea?

I imagine that a lot of you have ministries that you'd like to see our church doing. Have YOU ever said, "I wish our church would (fill in the blank)," then this article is particularly for YOU. (And if you wish SOMEONE ELSE would be doing these things ...then for Heaven's sakes, when they try, encourage them and don't tell them how it's "supposed to be done!) Consider this God's tap on YOUR shoulder. Here's the thing, though: you might wish that we had these ministries (and others!) going, but unless YOU are willing to step up and direct them, they may not get accomplished. In fact, they probably won't. They won't, because unless folks step up and answer God's Call on their lives, unless folks offer their gifts and talents for the upbuilding of God's Church, things will stay pretty quiet around the building.

Abundant life is *noisy*! Consider how quiet it is inside a hospital room where someone is really sick (or in a coffin where death has already come) vs. a room full of happy, full-of-life kids. There's a big difference, isn't there? And LIFE is what we need to be about! Abundant life! We NEED our bones *dancing* and carrying full, healthy bodies.

I'm really excited about a few things I've seen this past year in the life of the church. I've seen the creation and functioning of a wonderful, life-giving Worship Team. (By the way, we're looking for a new chair for that group, so please step up for that!) I've seen many off-shoots of teams created from that group, such as the Visibility Team, the Music Team, and various other new ideas spawned from all of those meetings. I watched as people donated water, coolers, labels, time and talent as we provided free water to the community during the Oktemberfest parade!

We've got a new Children's Sunday School forming with plans to begin October 8th in the 0900 hour! Bring your children and your grandchildren! We've had a speaker from Job Corps speak to our Board and we've got a team from AMOS coming to speak to the whole church on the evening of October 12th (make sure to come and hear their presentation)! And our Elders are going on a Spiritual Retreat for a little instruction and some very much-needed R&R on October 3rd!

Our bones ARE beginning to come to life again, Praise God! I hear it in the hallways and I see it in our gatherings. May we continue to flesh out and then to DANCE into new life once again.

"15But speaking the truth in love, <u>we must grow up in every way into him</u> who is the head, into Christ, <u>16from whom the whole body</u>, joined and knitted together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, <u>promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love.</u>" (italics mine.)



September Mission


Today I took our grocery donations to the EFB. There was 101 pounds of food! They said to thank our parishioners. Thank you Central!!!!!

Advent and Christmas sign-up sheets are on the table in the gathering room.


