August 2019 Board Splinters

Robin Anctil, Board Chair, called the meeting to order and gave the opening prayer. Ten people were in attendance. The calendar check was completed and the minutes from the July meeting were approved.

Safety: Officer Chad Hillers from the Marshalltown Police Department joined us to discuss building security. With his input, we reviewed the Security Guideline for Central Christian Church. He noted that many churches have unrestricted access and lots of keys out, so we have a good start. Officer Hillers stressed the importance of having a plan to deal with a person coming into the building who is in distress. This could include a meeting place other than the office, and then having the office available for shelter if needed. In addition to locking the doors during service, try to limit access to other parts of the building. Some churches have video or alarm systems. He discussed types of training that could involve our congregation. One type of training is the ALICE: Alert, Lockdown, In-form, Counter, Evacuate. All schools in Marshall County have had this training, as well as other churches and businesses. The basic training would be a classroom situation, and would last for one and a half to two hours. There is the opportunity to have more training that would include active participation and demonstrations.

a. Pastor Diana noted that the Disciples of Christ denomination is encouraging preparation for an active shooting situation during worship.

b. The board decided to proceed with the initial classroom type training, with more extensive training a future possibility.

The Police Department does not write policy but will review and advise groups.

Property: Bob Cook noted just two items, the locking mailbox and a new ice maker. Information was given to Jim Gossett, who will work on those purchases.

Personnel: Marcia Gossett reported that Ken Fiscus will retire effective Sunday, Aug. 18. The motion to give him a retirement bonus of one month's pay was made by Marcia Gossett and seconded by Marla Cook. Motion approved. Mike Nablo will assume all custodial duties. His schedule will not include Sunday mornings, so the Property Committee will make a plan to cover these responsibilities. It was noted that Karen and Mike will be gone for a September vacation. The Personnel Committee will schedule coverage for their duties.

Finance/Treasurer: Jim Gossett

reported that giving for July was down. Some of the expenses noted were the Youth Mission trip, the Pastor education expenditure, Beth Campbell's Nicaragua Mission and Allison Sherman's Mission to Africa. All of these except for Allison's were on hand and from designated accounts. As of the Board meeting date, the congregation had given \$1,051 toward Allison's Mission, to be matched with \$1000 from Missions and Christian Education. We also wrote Beth a check for \$1985.50 for Nicaragua, which was donated by members over the past two years. The Board wants to express thanks for continued giving.

Missions: Judy Osgood reported that the Missions Committee agreed to donate \$600 toward former member Allison Sherman's mission trip to Kenya. We are collecting items to help fill the shelves at the Tiger Vault at Iowa Valley Community College. These are items needed by college students. We are also collecting non-food items for the Supply Closet at the House of Compassion until the end of August.

Elders: <u>Jim Anctil</u> No Report.

Congregational Representatives:

<u>María Cook and Carolyn Thompson</u> Carolyn Thompson sent a written report addressing member concerns. Pastor Diana and the Board take these concerns seriously, and very much appreciate this input. *DWF*: <u>Sarah Sade</u> Three cards were sent and baby quilt was sold.

Pastor's Report: <u>Diana</u> stressed that the Board puts policies into place. Staff members do not, and should not be subjected to abuse.

a. Efforts are made to communicate church information. Events and information are included in the Newsletter, during announcement time, on the screens, through emails and on the Central Facebook page.

b. The Tree - The Magnolia tree is split and not safe. Jim Gossett made the motion to remove it, Mary Hazelwood seconded and the motion was approved.

c. Dates: September 1 - Hymn Sing (Collette will facilitate)

d. September 22 - Potluck luncheon with our nesting congregation at 1:00. Worship will move to 11:30 for that day only.

e. September 29 - Pastor Diana will be gone. The new regional interim pastor John Richardson will be in the pulpit.

Old Business: The Security Guidelines have been updated. Marla Cook made a motion to accept them as written. Melia seconded, and the motion was approved.

The Potluck with our nesting congregation is happening. Their youth will help with clean-up.

New Business/Other Items:

The Security Team will schedule a meeting in August. Members are: Pastor Diana, Karen Nablo, Jim Anctil, Robin Anctil, Jim Gossett, Mike Nablo.

There is a form required by the Secretary of State to completed every other year to maintain our business status. It is suggested that this be placed on the December agenda as a reminder to complete it.

Robin will contact members of the Nominating Committee, since August is the time for that process to get started.

Jim Gossett presented information about Allison Sherman's African mission and fundraising. The congregation will see announcements on the screen and in the bulletin and hear an announcement/explanation Sunday, July 21.

Meeting was adjourned.

In September, Missions will be collecting items needed at the Iowa River Hospice House. In the past, DWF has made frozen cookie dough balls for them to have to bake for the families of the patients. Kenya Mission Update

Allison Sherman was very active in Central's youth groups during the early 2000's along with her sister Secily, Kelly (Anctil) Bailey, Melia (Cook) Chapman, the Dalluge boys and others. She is planning to travel to Kenya for mission work in September with the Africa Inland Mission organization.

You have stepped forward in a big way to support her mission by giving \$1,051. Along with this, \$400 was given from the Christian Education Memorial account and \$600 from the Missions Memorial account for a total of \$2,051. We also filled bags with school supplies that you provided for all the classes in both schools. The teachers were so thankful to have things for the kids whose families can't afford supplies. OUR Nesting Congregation

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Since May 2017, our congregation has hosted a Spanish-speaking Assembly of God congregation, Camino de Vida (Way of Life), commonly referred to as "the nesting congregation." The group previously met at the Best Western Regency, but was unable to afford room rental given it's small membership of just four families.

Under the leadership of Pastors Victor and Toni Valdez, the nesting congregation meets here on Wednesday evenings and Sunday afternoons/early evenings for worship and Bible study; it also uses the building at other times with permission from the staff. The group gives a free-will offering to our church and is hopeful, over time, to grow its participation to numbers sufficient to finance a building and move into their own location. According to research on nesting congregations, that could take several years.

Currently, Camino de Vida has weekly participation of about 25-30 people. Our Church Board is planning to schedule a time this fall when our two congregations can meet for a potluck meal and get acquainted. The nesting congregation continues to be grateful for the opportunity to worship in our building.

UPDATED - Security Guideline for Central Christian

To create a safer and more secure church environment for our staff, members and invited guests, Central Christian Church has implemented these facility-related guidelines:

- We are limiting the number of doors open for public access. The south/ramp door will remain locked at all times.
 - Anyone who wishes to enter during church office hours (Tuesday through Friday from 9am to 1pm) will be required to press the doorbell/security buzzer (even if he/she has a church key).
 - ♦ Once admitted into the building, people are asked to let the Office Administrator/Minister know where they will be and also when they are leaving the building. In this way, the staff will always know who is in the building, which greatly increases their own sense of personal safety and well-being.
 - ♦ At the staff's discretion, the west/gathering are door can be locked if no one within eyesight/earshot to monitor incoming traffic or unlocked if staff are able to monitor traffic. All other doors will remain locked unless being used as an emergency exit.
- On Sunday mornings, the south/ramp and west/gathering area doors will be open from 8:30 until 10:10am, at which time the south/ramp door will be locked by the Deacon Captain. The Deacon Captain will be in the gathering area and will lock the west/gathering area doors following the Announcements (about 10:20am). Anyone wanting access to the building after that time should suse the west door and flag the Deacon Captain for entrance.
- Signage will be posted so that members and guests know how and when to access the building on any given day.
- The church has non-duplicatable keys and is limiting access to those keys. Those to be assigned keys include: all staff, Board Chair, Board Vice Chair, Treasurer, Property Committee members, Finance Committee members, Personnel Chair, Christian Education Chair, Worship Committee Chair, DWF Chair, DWF Hospitality Chair (funerals/weddings), Missions Chair, and Deacon Chair. Invited building guests who sign a Building Use Form will also be assigned a church key. **Staff members are not authorized to assign keys except to those named here.**
 - ♦ The Office Administrator will keep track of all assigned keys, and key assignments will be reviewed annually (December/January) by the Church Board.
 - Those who need a church key for an event (e.g. Rummage Sale, Holiday Stroll meal, youth event, facility rentals, Vacation Bible School, etc.) can check one out from the church office for a specific time period, after which time the key should be returned. There will be a \$10 security deposit for checked out keys, which will be returned when the key is returned to the office.
 - Anyone else who wants a church key can contact the Board Chair or other Board member and the Board will consider that request at its next meeting.
- Those with keys who access the building outside of church office hours are urged to be vigilant and safety conscious. At no time and for no reason should church doors be propped open without someone watching the door.
- This Security Guideline will be provided to all members with building keys and invited building guests (e.g. Narcotics Anonymous, Nesting Congregation, Sweet Adelines, etc.), as well as those assigned temporary building keys. All keyholders will be asked to sign the Guideline below. The signed document will be kept in the church office, and keyholders will be given a copy.
 - ♦ It is recommended by the Church Safety Team that the guideline be published in the church newsletter annually.

• SECURITY GUIDELINE VIOLATIONS

- Any member who violates this guideline will be provided with a printed copy of the guideline and asked to affirm his/her understanding of the guideline and willingness to comply.
- Member keyholders who violate this guideline will be reminded of their signed agreement to comply with the guideline. Keyholders who repeatedly violate the guideline will be asked to turn in their building key.
- Any invited building guests who violate this guideline will be reminded of their signed Building Usage Form/Security Guideline and asked to reaffirm their willingness to comply. Those who repeatedly violate the guideline will be asked to find another location for their meetings/events and turn in their building key.

Training and instructions on how to operate the buzzer/access system will be provided to any member interested; contact a staff member for training.

The Church Board and Church Safety Team welcome comments, questions, and suggested improvements at any time. Please direct any comments, questions, or suggestions to the Board Chair, Minister, or any Church Board member or Safety Team member. all input will be considered in a timely manner, and feedback will be provided as appropriate.


