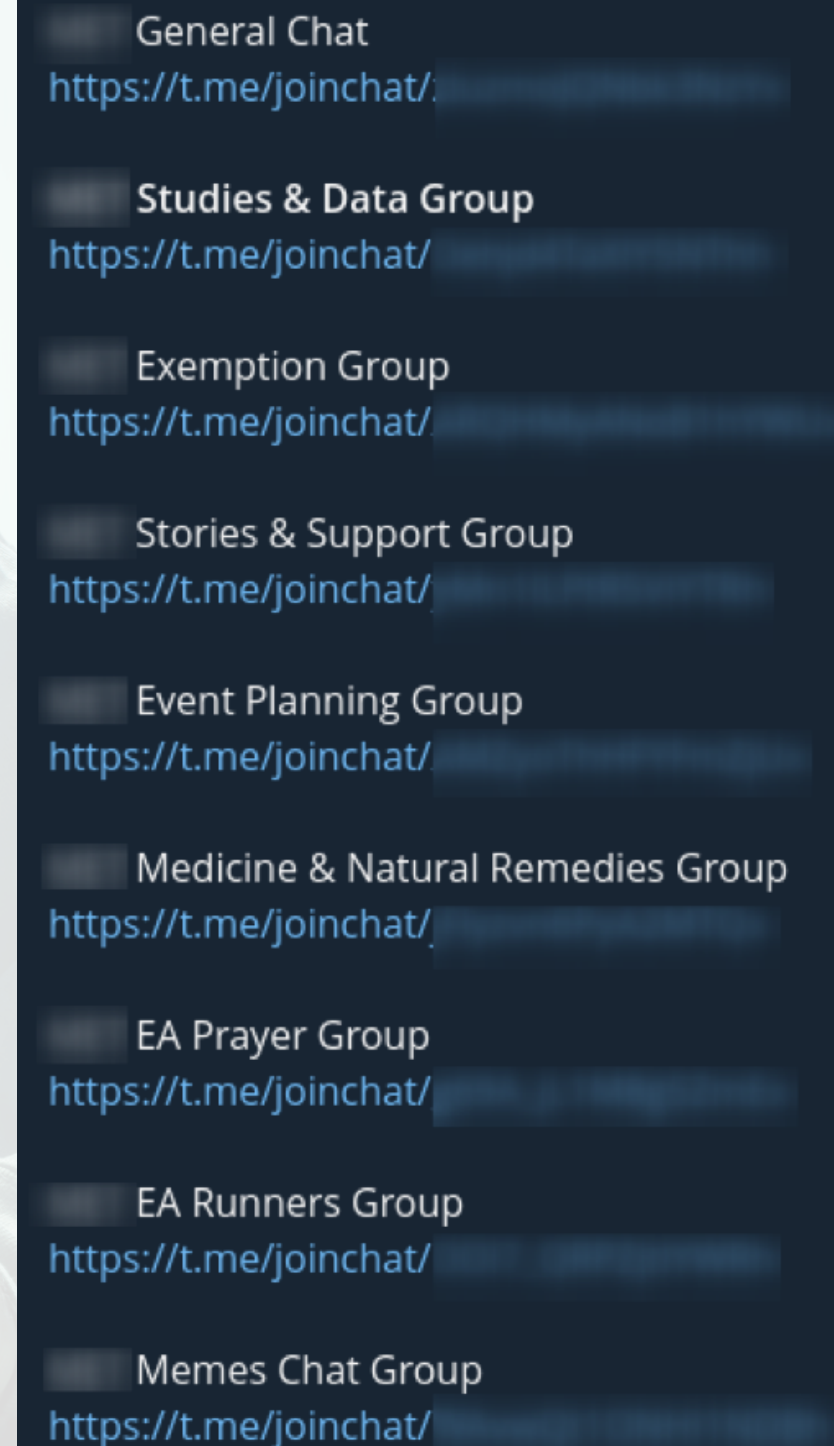
Create additional Private Telegram GROUPS per these instructions:

Create these groups (at a minimum):

- Planning Group – Invite Only Group for a small leadership team (Do not share this link)
- General Chat Group
- Exemptions Group
- Event Planning Group

Broadcast a CHANNEL message that contains all of the group links that you created above along with any others that may be deemed necessary to segregate some of the potentially excessive chatter from the main General Chat created above:

Organize an In-Person Meeting

Once the method of anonymous communication is established and you start to gain followers through word-of-mouth, it is vital to quickly set up an in-person meeting to get interested people together.

We recommend asking a local church if you can use their facility to meet, and putting out an offering bucket to take donations for use of the building.

Host this meet and greet meeting for people to get to know one another and voice their feelings and concerns. An open mic format is encouraged. It is at this meeting that your core leadership team should start to emerge. Give people a chance to let you know what they bring to the table in terms of skill set. You will want people of all walks and backgrounds - people with speaking and organization skills, technical skills, etc.

As team members start to come forward, make sure you gather their personal cell numbers for communication and get them into the anonymous communication, if they are not yet connected there.

Form an Executive Planning Team

Once you've established your core team from those who've come forward at the in-person meeting, it is important to have another in-person meeting with that team. At that meeting you should discuss each individual's strengths and where they can be best applied. This team should meet on a regular basis.

Some of the key positions we've identified are:

Writer - someone comfortable drafting email notifications, constructing petitions, etc.

Marketer - someone who can create event and messaging flyers, posters for at events, and take the writers' content and put it into a nice format.

Organizational Lead - someone comfortable taking the lead on organizing large events

Public Speaker/Face- a person who can be the media contact and main speaker at events

Technical Support - someone in IT or with knowledge about building a simple website, apps, etc.

Legal - an attorney from your organization or outside that can lend assistance and be a sounding board

Advocate - can be someone from the organization or community willing to make connections, help get you media attention, etc.

General Support - people willing to help with miscellaneous tasks at events, host meetings, etc. Do not underestimate the value of these individuals, as they are there to alleviate burden.

Develop a Mission Statement

You will want to develop a clear and concise mission statement that captures the essence of what you are trying to accomplish.

Example:

Statement of Purpose:

This group exists to advocate for federal sub-contractor company employees who have made a personal decision to not take the COVID19 vaccine. We seek to protect their right to employment at the companies which chose to hire them based on merit and standing, which has only become threatened due to federal Executive Order 14042 and the associated FAR clause, released September 30, 2021.

Establish an EIN, DBA and Bank Account, and Related Tasks

1. Create a business:
 - Go to Erie County website and get forms for filing a Doing Business As account, or DBA

2. Obtain an EIN from IRS website
 - [Click here](#)
3. Set up an email from a secure server (Proton mail)
4. Draft business mission statement and have notarized
5. Open a DBA checking account with business name
6. Set up GiveSendGo, Eventbrite, or whatever fundraising site, linked to new DBA account
7. Now you can collect online/cash donations, put them into your DBA, and write checks to vendors/lawyers, etc.

Create a Website and Establish an Email Address

Assuming you've identified your technical lead, you will want to create a simple website similar to nomandateusa.com to house all of your content. Some items you should place there are - your mission statement, any upcoming events, petitions, contact info, etc.

Use hosting providers godaddy.com or bluehost.com, you can purchase your domain name and website package all in one place. Consider using Wordpress or their website builders to get up and running quickly as well as enable anyone to update the site. Many of these options integrate with social media as well.

Make sure you get an SSL certificate and purchase any domain name protection offered. This will help ensure the site is protected and creator information stays private.

Email: Create an email address for the group using a secure platform like Proton mail. Google, Yahoo and other popular platforms could be easily hacked or sabotaged. Consider using MailChimp for your email blasts as it provides people a way to easily opt in or out. It also allows anyone to quickly create stylish emails and manage a campaign.

Note: We have experienced issues with the bulk mail going to spam, dependent on the recipients server.

Grow Your Following

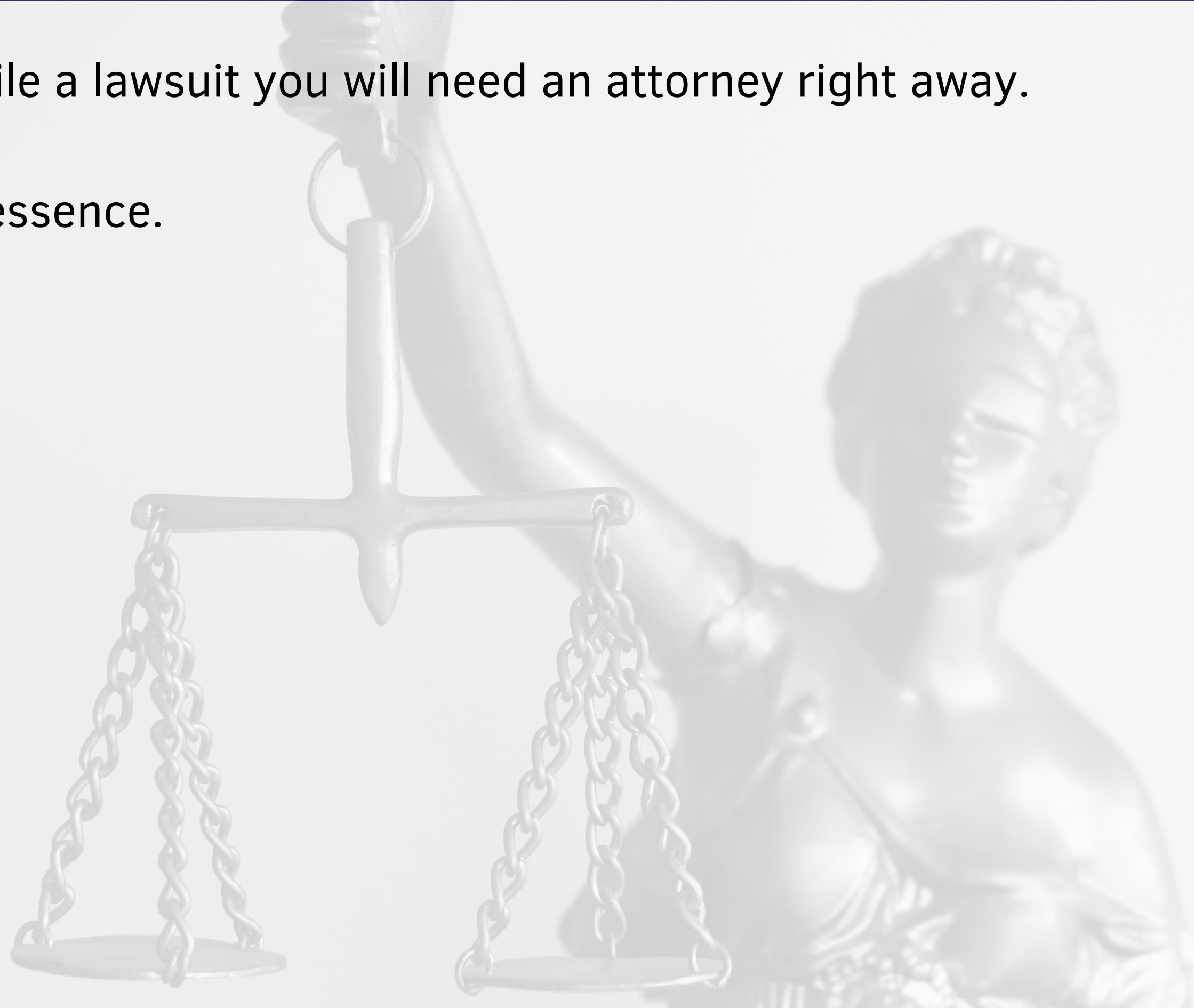
Once you publish your website it will be important to get the word out quickly and through many channels.

Leverage your core group, other local or nationwide groups and those on your anonymous chat by asking them to post your website to their personal social media accounts and to send to friends and family.

Get Legal Counsel

If you plan to file a lawsuit you will need an attorney right away.

Time is of the essence.



Create and Distribute Petitions

Starting a petition is a good way to gain support and momentum for your cause. In our case, we started a petition to stop the Clear App that our company wants to use to track our personal and medical data.

Sites like [Change.org](https://www.change.org) can be used to create petitions and then it can be posted to your website and shared to your chat followers. As with growing your website following, you will want to use the same methods to promote your petition and leverage your audience.

Set up a Fund Raising Site

We recommend a site like **Give, Send, Go**. Recently **Go Fund Me** has suspended anything vaccine related. Give, Send, Go is a free-speech friendly alternative.

Once your site is live, advertise through your anonymous communication, and ask everyone to post to their respective social media accounts, as well as sharing with friends, family and co-workers. Word-of-mouth spreads quickly!



Organize an Event to Raise Funds

This is where your Organizational Lead comes into play identifying a cost-effective venue, free entertainment and starting a larger planning committee. The anonymous communication method can be used to for group communications. Our lead was able to find a co-worker who was a DJ and offered their services for free, with an advertising plug.

We chose to hold a large Buffalo Bills watch party with pizza and other low-cost food at a venue that donated the space to us. We called various local business and had almost all of the food donated, as well as many baskets for a raffle. We also held a 50/50 auction.

Don't forget to thank your sponsors, creating posters with their logos and giving them a shout out during the event.

Reach out to like minded area personalities who you think might support your event. For example, we had Doug Allen sing the national anthem.

A fundraiser can come in any shape or size and for those nervous to attempt a large scale event the first time, consider a bake sale or car wash.

Note: Leverage friends and family of your Executive Planning Team to help at the event. We found that people were eager to support their spouses and family members and their help was needed to run the actual event.

Structure of the Religious Exemption Letter:

- Introduction
 - State that you are requesting a religious exemption to the COVID-19 vaccine
 - State that you are seeking reasonable accommodations
 - You may want to request confidentiality of your request/letter
- Religious Background
 - State what your faith is
 - Explain how you first believed
 - Explain your relationship with God
 - If applicable:
 - Do you go to church?
 - Do you pray?
 - Do you read religious texts?
 - Is your faith something that you share with your family?
 - Are there moments in which you have seen the power of your faith? (e.g., miracles, healings, answered prayers, etc.)
- Objections
 - Spend one paragraph introducing and listing all your objections to the COVID-19 vaccine
 - Spend a paragraph or more explaining each of your objection
 - Do not forget to link it back to the COVID-19 vaccine
 - Example:

Objections to the COVID-19 Vaccine

I object to the COVID-19 vaccine due to the following reasons: (1) ABCDEFG, (2) HIJKLMN, and (3) OPQRSTUV

ABCDEFG

In the Bible, it is said: "*ABCDE*". TUV 1:1. In another place, it says, "*EFG*". XYZ 2:3. In accordance with the Bible, I believe that I cannot *ABCDEFG*. If I *ABCDEFG*, I believe that is a sin. Therefore, due to the Bible's restrictions on *ABCDEFG*, I object to receiving the COVID-19 vaccine.

HIJKLMN

In the Bible, it is said: "*HIJKLMN*". PQR 5:5. In accordance with the Bible, I believe that I cannot *HIJKLMN*. I had experienced a similar situation in which I witnessed *HIJKLMN*... Therefore, I object to receiving the COVID-19 vaccine.

OPQRSTUV

.....

- Conclusion
 - Restate the request for religious exemption

Things to remember:

- Keep your audience in mind
 - Watch your tone. Do not be aggressive. Be gentle, respectful, and most of all HONEST. 1 Peter 3:15-16.
 - Don't complain about the mandate
 - Don't blame or take it out on your employer.
- Do not worry if you don't go to church or aren't part of an organized religion
 - Explain your beliefs as best you can. Remember, the standard is a deeply held, personal, and sincere religious belief
- Do not worry if you don't agree with your religious leaders
 - You can deviate from the orthodoxy of your religion
- Do not mention politics
 - Biden administration, CDC, FDA, Constitution, Bill of Rights, First Amendment, Declaration of Independence, founding fathers, left-wing, political, "my rights," "religious freedom," "mandate," "tyranny," etc.
 - Rather say things like: "I believe," "my faith," "the Bible says," "God wishes," etc.
- Do not mention scientific or medical facts unless it is only for the limited purpose of tying it into your faith. If you do, keep it brief and immediately connect it to your faith-based objection.
- Do not state "facts" that are disputed by the mainstream
 - The vaccines are gene therapy, modify DNA, etc.
- Do not forget to tie back your objections to your faith, because any objections not tied back to your faith will be deemed simply "personal reservations"
 - Instead of "I am afraid...", you may want to rephrase and say "I believe that..." or "According to my faith, it is my duty..."
- If you are using aborted fetal cells as your objection, make sure you can answer whether the medications you may take were developed using or contain aborted fetal cells
 - Employers may try to throw a curve ball and say that medications like aspirin, Tylenol (acetaminophen), Motrin/Advil (ibuprofen), Sudafed (pseudoephedrine), TUMS, Pepto-Bismol, and other medications were tested with aborted fetal cells, BUT the medications were discovered, invented, and developed long before abortion was legalized in 1973.
- If you object to all vaccines, you may wish to state so.
- If you object not to all vaccines, you may wish to differentiate between vaccines. If applicable, be prepared to answer some of the below questions. You may want to preemptively address these issues.
 - If you have recently received a different vaccine, why aren't you willing to receive a COVID-19 vaccine?
 - If you give your kids the vaccines required for school, why won't you get the COVID-19 vaccine?
 - Is there a difference between the COVID-19 vaccine and other vaccines like for polio, tetanus, pertussis, measles, etc.?
 - If you get the flu shot, why do you not want to get the COVID-19 shot?
- Be delicate with objections like "the mark of the beast" or other objections that your employer may write off as "crazy". In such instances, try to let the religious texts do the talking.
