## A short history...


Pilchard Cottage was built as a fisherman's cottage at the turn of the 19<sup>th</sup> century, the main catch during this period were pilchards, which were landed in vast numbers directly onto the beach.

Originally the fishermen and their families would have lived closer to the coastline, however during the gentrification of Dawlish during the Georgian period, the Lord of the Manor decided to relocate the riff raff away from the delicate gaze of the well-heeled visitors, who would arrive in great numbers during the summer to take in the sea air.

Pilchard Cottage is located in one of the oldest parts of Dawlish, it is made of cob; a traditional west-country building material consisting of mud and straw!

The cottage has been a home to many families over the last two hundred years, it has also been a shop and a workshop for; a Plumber, Cobbler, Butcher, and a Wheelwright to name but a few. It is also thought that the dining room used to be a wash house where the women would boil laundry in a wash copper (the old chimney breast is still visible in the dining room and the back bedroom).

In the 1860s a Plumber & Gas Fitter named Edward Johns lived in this cottage with his large family, they paid £5 each year to live here. We think that Edward built the ornate metal railings on Jubilee Bridge in the heart of the town centre in 1870. Keep an eye out for his embossed initials on the railings when you pop down to the Brook to see the Black Swans!









### **Dawlish Highlights**

#### Sunrise -

The best place to watch the sunrise is from the bridge over the railway line between Marine Parade and Boat Cove.





## Sunset -

Standing on Jubilee Bridge in Dawlish, with your back to the sea. Alternatively, watch from the Back Beach at Teignmouth whilst eating fish and chips from Finn McCools.

#### Beach -

Coryton Cove is a lovely sandy beach tucked away behind the towering red sandstone cliffs, the railway line runs through the cliffs at the back of the beach. Coryton Cove is popular for sea swimming and water sports.





The beach is served by a wonderful Italian Kiosk called The Cove Café where they serve drinks, cakes, and mouthwatering pizza.

It is also possible to hire one of the colourful beach huts from Teignbridge Council.

There are public toilets a couple of minutes away at Boat Cove. It is possible to access this area from the town with a scooter or wheelchair.

## Trains -

Throughout the year we often have nostalgic steam and heritage diesel trains passing through the town, drawing lots of visitors from far and wide. Tides permitting our favourite viewing point is the breakwater at the far end of Coryton Cove, although it is fun to stand on the bridge at the end of Marine Parade as a steam train passes beneath.









### Dawlish Ditto Trail -

If you haven't heard of the Dittos before, then you are in for a treat! The Dittos are helpful little residents of Dawlish who live in beautifully intricate handmade wooden houses around the town. We have left a Ditto trail map next to your welcome basket, so you can see how many little houses you can spot!)

The Dittos travel around on their magical flying scooters, looking after the wildlife and keeping the town clean and tidy. You can read about the Dittos in their first book 'The Captain of the Black Swan', the book is on our bookshelf ready for you to read, a Ditto colouring book is in the colouring box in the wardrobe.

### History Trail -

Learn about the history of Dawlish and discover some very old and quirky buildings around the town with the town's history trail. We have placed a copy of the trail next to your welcome basket. If there is a child in your party you can collect a brass rubbing sheet from any of these places in the Town Centre; Living Hub Store on the Strand, The Strand Community Centre, Railway Station, or Community Library.

### The Black Swans & Waterfowl -

As I'm sure you're aware, Dawlish is the home of the Black Swan, in fact we're a bit swan mad. Our current mating pair are named Bert and Kimba, so far, they have had three clutches of cygnets together. Bert can be a little antisocial during the nesting stage and extremely territorial, often seen chasing the other swans into the road or harassing the geese. Black Swans generally have their offspring during the winter.



We also have a wonderful array of waterfowl on our lovely brook including; Shelducks, Mandarin Ducks, Carolina Ducks, Chinese Geese, Red Crested Pochard and Whistling Ducks. Make sure to check the incubation window to see the newborn chicks waddling around under the heat lamps.



### Walking and Cycling -

The joys of living in semi-rural Dawlish are that from the front door of Pilchard Cottage you can turn right for a nice walk along the sea front (South West Coast Path), or you could turn left and explore our beautiful countryside in a matter of minutes.

There are lots of walking books on the bookshelf for your perusal.

### Play Park -

A new playpark was opened in Manor Gardens in 2023, it has some fantastic facilities for younger and older children. The park is only a few minutes walk from Pilchard Cottage. There is also a lovely trail leading to the park from The Lawn.





## Golf -

Take a trip on the wild side and have a game of mini golf in the heart of Dawlish, next to The Brook.

If you fancy a proper game of golf then Dawlish Warren Links Golf Club, Starcross Golf Course & Teignmouth Golf Course are all very close by.

#### Dawlish Museum -

Open during the summer months, Dawlish Museum is a lovely little place full of artifacts. Great for a rainy day, admission is very cheap and the volunteers who run it are lovely. Dawlish Museum has interesting exhibits from Bill Millin's bagpipes (The D-Day Piper), the Victorian Period and the infamous Dawlish sea wall collapse in 2014. https://www.devonmuseums.net/Dawlish-Museum/Devon-Museums/

### **Shaftesbury Theatre –**

Constructed in 1881 and opened as a theatre in 1959, Shaftesbury Theatre is a wonderful addition to the town and puts on many productions throughout the year, which are very popular so booking early is advised.

Types of events; plays, cinema nights, pantomimes and local talks.





#### Forest Fungi & Farm Shop -

Have you ever been to an exotic mushroom farm? Forest Fungi is a highly acclaimed mushroom grower here in Dawlish and you can book on a tour of their unique "farm", learn how the mushrooms grow and even pick your own. Featured on Celebrity Chef

James Martin's TV Show 'Islands to Highlands'. There is also a lovely farm shop and café, which does a fantastic breakfast.

### Dawlish Warren Nature Reserve -

Have a wonderful walk around Dawlish Warren, which is a Site of Special Scientific Interest, a National Nature Reserve, and forms part of the Exe Estuary Special Protection Area. The Warren is the main roosting area for the estuary's birds and has over 600 types of British wild plant.

Dawlish Warren is important for birds all year round

as a feeding, resting, and breeding area. In winter thousands of birds escape the cold of the arctic to spend the winter on the Exe. In spring and autumn, the Warren is a vital resting area for birds

travelling between Africa and the Arctic Circle. Birds also use the beach for nesting in the summer.

#### Library -

If you can't find something that takes your fancy on our bookshelves, then pop down the road to Dawlish Library. Fortunately, the library has improved significantly since 1804 when Jane Austen visited and declared it "particularly pitiful and wretched".

#### Food -

As you walk down The Strand, you'll notice that there are a lot of food establishments; from pubs to cafes, ice cream parlours to bakeries and Fish & Chip takeaways.

### **Special Events -**

Dawlish has a fantastic timetable of annual community events, in fact most of Devon's towns and villages put on lovely events throughout the year. Some of the highlights of Dawlish's calendar include; Easter Egg Trail, Luscombe Castle Charity Day, Two Castles Vintage Cycle Ride, Turn the Tide Festival, Armed Forces Day and Parade, Dawlish Celebrates Classic Vehicles, Dawlish Ladies Hockey Club Family Funday on The Lawn, Dawlish Garden Society Summer Show, Brass Bands & Live Bands on The Lawn, Dawlish Carnival in August, Picnic in The Marquee, Dawlish Celebrates Seaside Fun (including Punch & Judy), Dawlish Walking Festival in September, Dawlish Triathlon, Bike & Trike Show on The Lawn, EAT Festival, Pumpkin Trail, Merchant Navy Day, Armistice Day, Remembrance Sunday Parade, Yarn Bombing and theatre events throughout the year and the Christmas Lights Switch on & 2 day Christmas Market on The Strand.













### **Evenings in Dawlish -**

Dawlish is generally a quiet town, we do however have a lot of pubs who offer regular live music events, karaoke and pub quizzes. Before your stay, check to see what is on at the Shaftesbury Theatre as tickets to some events sell out fast.

On a clear night, it is lovely to head down to the sea front and have a stroll along 'The King's Walk' (sea wall) and do some stargazing out to sea.

### Powderham Castle -

Powderham Castle is the nearest castle to Dawlish which is open to the public (we have a beautiful castle in Dawlish but it's a private residence).

Powderham is a wonderful castle set on a stunning estate in the village of Kenton, with far reaching views of the River Exe. It is home to the Earl of Devon and his

family and over the last decade, the castle has been transformed into a great tourist attraction. Not only can you visit the castle and its grounds, but you can also; see the animals, visit the farm shop, eat in the café, walk alpacas or goats around the grounds, groom ponies and attend some huge concerts and events. At Christmas the castle and gardens are lit up for 'Christmas at the Castle'.

## National Trust / English Heritage (there are many more than listed below) -

### Greenway

Although we are a little biased, we think that Greenway is one of the best National Trust venues in the area. Former holiday home of internationally famous author Agatha Christie.

Set on the banks of the stunning river Dart. Greenway is utterly beautiful; you can explore the house, kitchen gardens, the front lawn, Camelia Garden, Boat House, play tennis and have a lovely cream tea sat in the courtyard.



Letti's mother grew up on the farm behind Greenway and her mother spent her childhood playing in the gardens, Letti's grandfather used to deliver milk to Agatha (or Aggie as she was known to the family) enjoying chats on the kitchen doorstep at dawn when she was in residence.

### Haldon Forest -

1,400 hectares of woodland just 15/20 minutes from Dawlish. Extremely popular whether you want a quiet gentle stroll or an exhilarating mountain biking experience, there's something for you at Haldon Forest Park. Haldon Forest Park is the perfect place for great value days out with kids, friends, or family. If you're looking for cheap ways to entertain the children or space to get back to nature, look no further than Haldon Forest Park. Don't forget to pick up an activity trail leaflet from the Visitors Centre!

Haldon Forest Park offers a range of walking and cycling trails to suit all abilities, as well as orienteering courses, treetop rope course, and so much more just waiting to be discovered.

#### Go Ape @ Haldon Forest -

Go Ape Haldon Forest is as far south as we venture. Your adventure though is definitely northwards as you scale the heights of the treetops. A great location for thrill seekers and family adventurers with hilltop to hilltop zip wires and daring high level crossings. ## Teignmouth -

Teignmouth is the nearest town to Dawlish, it only take a few minutes to reach by train, bus or car. You could even walk there on the **South West Coast Path**. Teignmouth has lots to offer including; **scuba diving** @ **Teign Diving Centre**, lots of **boat trips** as mentioned above, **Teignmouth Lido**, lovely **walks** around the town and promenade and don't forget to take some change for the amusement arcade on the **pier**!

'The Point' at Teignmouth is usually very good for **sea glass hunting** at low tide. We have found several large chunks of 'pirate glass' there over the years (too chunky to fit into our beachcombing jar unfortunately). It is also a great place to watch very **large ships** come into port through a very narrow channel at high tide. http://teigndivingcentre.co.uk/

#### Exeter -

Exeter is the nearest city to Dawlish; it only takes 20 minutes or so to reach on the train and it is definitely worth a visit.

#### **Exeter Cathedral**

Exeter Cathedral is one of Europe's great cathedrals. The building was significantly developed from the 12th to 14th centuries and remains the most complete example of a first rank church in the English Decorated architectural style.

Exeter Cathedral has the longest uninterrupted medieval vaulted ceiling in the world, at about 96 m (315 ft). It is also the location each year of a fantastic Christmas Market.



#### **Exeter Red Coat Tours**

Exeter City Council run a fantastic program of free guided tours (completely free, no tip) run by volunteers. There are lots of different tours available, here is a selection of some of the tours available; Medieval Exeter, Cathedral to Quay, Georgian Exeter, Ghosts & Legends, Cathedral Close & Bishops Palace Garden, Exeter Old & New, Exeter's Historic Quayside and Forgotten Exeter (Roman Walls).

Special tours include; Writers Around Exeter, Mystery Tour, Exeter Blitz, Halloween Tour and Royalty in Exeter.

Medieval passages under the city centre, designed to bring water from natural springs outside of the old walled city. It is also very close to part of the old Roman wall.



#### Shopping

If you feel the need to splurge, Exeter is probably the best place in Devon to go shopping, with a wide range of chain and independent shops.

#### Dartmoor -

Dartmoor is an extremely special part of Devon, it is vast, undulating and full of stunning scenery, including; granite rock tors, ancient stunted oak forests, waterfalls, rivers, lakes, reservoirs, dark skies for stargazing, remains of bronze age settlements, hiking trails, wild animals, ghosts & legends, epic driving roads, old pubs with log burners and



great food, wonderful gateway towns and villages, adrenaline packed activities and much more.

On a clear day, one of the best drives is from **Ashburton** to **Tavistock**. Both lovely towns with lots to offer in their own right, you will have a great day out even if you don't want to put on a pair of walking boots! Please take 'Moor care' as **Wild ponies**, sheep and cows are frequently found wandering in the road.

Bellever Forest, Wistman's Woods,
Dartmeet, Jay's Grave, Tottiford &
Trenchford Reservoir to name just a
few!

The Lydford Gorge (National Trust) walk is the best for waterfalls and scenery, it is also possible to see a waterfall at **Canonteign Falls** and **Becky Falls**. **Kayaking** experiences are widely available and well worth a go if you like adrenaline sports.

A great National Trust property on Dartmoor is **Castle Drogo** (incidentally it's where Dan's great grandfather used to deliver milk to from their family farm in Drewsteignton). A wonderful pub near Castle Drogo is the **Fingle Bridge Inn**, set in utterly stunning scenery, it's a great place for lunch on a nice day next to the river.

### **Paignton**

Paignton is a traditional seaside town with lots of bucket and spade shops and a large **cinema**. It has two lovely mini golf courses, one on Paignton Green and the other at the end of **Paignton Pier**.

Paignton is also the start point for the **Dartmouth Steam Train** trip to Kingswear (for Dartmouth), which is a fantastic experience.

Paignton is also home to the magnificent **Paignton Zoo**, a great place for a full day out.

**Goodrington** Beach is slightly further down the coast from Paignton. It has a great beach with rock pools and beach huts, you can also watch the steam trains from the beach several times a day during the warmer months.

Goodrington is also home to **Splashdown**, the largest **waterslide park** in the area and very popular with children, both young and old!

#### Brixham

A trip to **Brixham Battery Museum**

If you like fish and early starts, for a special treat you can book yourself onto the **Brixham Fish Market Tour** on special dates throughout the year. Experience the 'shout' auction, learn about the fish and the boats and then afterwards head to **Rock Fish for a special fishy breakfast**, which is included in the price of the tour. #### Exmouth

Exmouth is a lovely **seaside town**, situated at the mouth of the **River Exe**. It has long **sandy beaches**, a nice town centre, **pretty harbour**, a lovely view of Dawlish Warren and the odd **seal** lounging around on pontoons and boats in the river. Exmouth is also home to **World of Country Life**, an all-weather family day out attraction that has an eclectic mix of museums, animals, play areas and entertainment, both outdoors and undercover, making it an excellent day out for the whole family, whatever the age, whatever the weather!

**Stuart Line Boat Trips** start from Exmouth Harbour and offer a large array of destinations and trip lengths, as mentioned above.



### **River Exe Café**

For a unique dining experience, we would highly recommend lunch at the River Exe Café. Accessible only by water taxi or your own boat. The café is a floating pontoon moored in the middle of the river and only open during the warmer months. **Perfect for a special occasion or treat.**Booking well in advance is essential.

## The South Hams

The south Hams is a large area which encompasses the following towns and villages (and more)

Dartmouth, Kingswear, Salcombe, Dittisham,

Bigbury, and Bantham.

This is a beautiful part of the world and known for its golden sandy beaches, rugged coastline, pretty architecture and glorious rivers.

Salcombe is known locally as Chelsea on Sea, if you're feeling particularly flush you may want to spend a day at the spa at the Harbour Hotel in Salcombe, with stunning views over the estuary.



## **Plymouth**

The historic naval city of Plymouth is the second closest city to Dawlish and has lots to offer visitors of all ages. Easily reachable by train through the pretty English Countryside, some of our favourite Plymouth activities are; a narrated **Boat Trip** around the **Naval dockyard** where you can see warships and submarines, a guided tour of **Drakes Island**, visiting **The Box** museum which is new, free and great for all ages (perfect for a rainy day), **Plymouth Aquarium** (also perfect for a rainy day), a guided tour of the English Heritage site '**Plymouth Citadel**' prebooking required as it is an active naval base, **Plymouth Lido**; a beautiful sea pool, walk along the **Hoe** to visit **Smeaton's Tower** and have a tour of the **Plymouth Gin Distillery** and enjoy a few glasses in their lovely bar.

A huge part of Plymouth's history was the departure of **The Mayflower** in 1620 with

the Founding Fathers onboard, sailing for 10 weeks to start a new life and country in what is now known as The United States of America. You can visit the City's **Mayflower Museum** and try and find the original steps used in the sailing (which are now believed to be under the ladies' toilets in a pub on the harbourside).


