IJM is the global leader in strengthening justice systems to protect people in poverty from violence.

Injustice strikes the hardest at people in poverty, trapping millions of men, women and children in fear and violence. Human traffickers exploit their vulnerability for profit and millions of women and children are hurt each year in the places and relationships in which they should feel safe.

IJM is accelerating justice around the world. As one of the world's foremost leaders in justice-driven innovation, IJM has helped drive the largest documented reductions of modern slavery and violence in the world. We partner with survivors, communities, governments and authorities to stop violence, strengthen justice systems and courageously advance protection for the most vulnerable — **until all are free.**

Through our global Community Protection Model, we've helped reduce violence by up to 86% in the communities where we work.

GLOBAL COMMUNITY IMPACT

Founded in 1997, IJM is the largest anti-trafficking organization in the world today. Based in Washington D.C., our work spans four continents and 20 countries. Ninety percent of our staff are local leaders changing the trajectory of their communities and nations' justice systems.



"This justice is not only for us. It's for my children and for other families who could become victims too."

When brokers promised Mon's family legal work on a sugarcane plantation in Thailand, it sounded like a path to a better future. Instead, the family of 10 — including seven young children — were trapped in forced labor, working from sunup to sundown cutting sugarcane and clearing farmland. After escaping in the middle of the night, Thai and Cambodian authorities helped Mon's family safely return to Cambodia. There, IJM and partners helped Mon pursue justice and stood with her until the trafficker was convicted.

PROTECTING COMMUNITIES AT SCALE

Our global protection model has proven to measurably reduce violent crime and bring widespread protection to vulnerable communities. Together with partners, we're on a mission to **protect 500 million people** through:



Collaborative Casework

We work on specific cases to secure freedom and justice for victims of trafficking and slavery, sexual and domestic violence and police brutality.



Targeted System Transformation

We design targeted programs and training to address weaknesses within the justice system, based on insights and robust assessment.



Survivor Empowerment

We elevate survivor leadership to bring attention to violence and change how the justice system works.



Equipping Partners

We work locally with community leaders and authorities to implement solutions and advocate for stronger justice systems.



Measuring the Impact

We invest in third-party assessments to determine the effectiveness of the justice system and build tailored responses.

Modern Slavery

Millions of people — including children — are exploited every day for sex, labor, and profit, trapped in a cycle of violence they cannot escape.

Most sexual and domestic violence happens in the places where women and children should feel safest — their homes, relationships, and communities.

In Kenya, police abuse of power is widespread — 1 in 3 people has experienced police abuse or harassment in their lifetime.
