- -Introductions of Hospital Staff
- -Dawn French-Brief History of WP Hospital

Dr. Peacock:

- -History of cardiac treatment in WP.
- -Community need for high level of cardiac care in WP and Westchester collectively.
- Everything can now be done at WPH with extremely high care.
- -WPH needs more space and some patients are waiting for in-patient beds. DRs believe we deserve better and are excited about new space.
- -Double the size of the emergency rooms and patient care. All rooms in the emergency room will have private bathrooms and more privacy.

Josh Strugatz:

- -Update on parking lot and expansion west of the WPH campus.
- -March 2024 the parking garage closed and the open parking lot opened.
- -History of businesses that closed or moved from the Post Road and Dr. Martin Luther King Blvd.
- -August the demolition should be complete.
- -New expansion will connect with the lower three floors of the existing hospital.
- -Lots of room for expansion, more rooms for illness or child births. Ready for highest level of care for almost all situations.
- 2 Pavilions with 5 floors each-large projects- needs to be paid for over time in two phases. Part of the plan is to modernize and decouple many of the rooms in the already existing rooms.
- -Emergency Room: called for an off street drop off for loading and offloading patients and a pediatric emergency room.
- -lots of space, double height ceilings, and larger rooms and drop-off
- -Demolish 170 Maple Ave is part of the larger planned ambulatory facilities by 2026.
- -Old Lord and Taylor in Eastchester is also being developed at part of WP Hospital physician practices and Scarsdale Medical Group.
- 720 pages on the city website about the traffic study.
- Lots of parking for guests and residents. Parking is a major concern for residents in Fisher Hill and Highlands.
- -Deputy Commissioner of Traffic Thomas Soyk is working with the city to improve traffic in the area.
- -Would like to work with Rich Payne on making it easy to not use cars and look at other ways to get to work beside cars.



Post Road East and Soundview

-Joanne Delanoy: At the Fisher Hill meeting you said it would be 1000 spaces added to the new lot. Today you said significantly more than 1000. How is the city allowing you to build this massive hospital without a concrete plan for parking? **Josh Strugatz:** Explained how the city oversells permits for physical spots. WPH over purchases to ensure that there is parking for employees.

Vicki Presser- Thanks WPH staff and builders. They have lots of questions to ensure that all aspects of the development.

- -Hospital understands its impacts on traffic and parking.
- -Affordable housing has been discussed-don't have immediate plans for affordable housing for employees. The parking lot is not permanent and has the ability to be used for other needs over the next ten years.

Bob Friscia: Questions about a shuttle system to get employees to the hospital. Not necessarily needed

Mike Zygmat: Questions about imminent domain for the hospital? The answer was no.

Bob Kahn: Stressed the importance of affordable housing for employees. Also discussed the traffic concerns around the Cancer Center.
