Developmental Stages

6-12 years old

- -Orientated to parents and teachers
- -Focused attention on learning and solving problems
- -Enjoys group play with peers of same gender
- -Often competitive
- -Manages fears, anxieties, and aggression
- -Impressed by older role models
- -Learns behaviors from parents, peers, TV, role models
- -May begin to experiment6 with drugs-more concerned with physical effects than social

Ways to Encourage Growth

- -Teach coping skills
- -Involve the child in setting up expectations, rules and consequences before problems arise
- -Provide feedback on behavior
- -Use peer assistance and positive role models (limit negative influences)
- -Help them to become competent at making good decisions/choices
- -Promote healthy eating habits

13-18 years old

- -Focused on the present rather than the future
- -Preoccupied with self-presentation and acceptance of peers
- -Beginning of sexual exploration
- -Seeking opportunities for independent moral judgment
- -Feeling unsure and awkward in social skills
- -Motivated by peer pressure regarding drug use more than physical effects
- -Critical thinking skills are developed with practice

Ways to Encourage Growth

- -Promote leadership skills and identifying the consequences of their choices
- -Focus on self-respect
- -Encourage goals
- -Value and know their friends
- -Open lines of communication



How to prevent abuse

Most people want to love and care for their children, but parents can harm their children when stress, tiredness, lack of skills, information or support combine to make the pressures of caring for them overwhelming.

Understanding the behavior of parents and the possible triggers does not justify harm to a child or young person.

Parents are responsible for the care of their children and need to recognize when they need help before harm occurs.

With early identification and an appropriate response and support, children and young people can recover from their experiences of harm.


