LILLIAN ADKINS, LCSW

As many of you know, Lillian is planning to retire early next year. As such, she was honored at our recent Foster Parent and Volunteer appreciation dinner. The following is an excerpt from the tribute that was given by foster and adoptive parent Alexis Edwards: "Lillian Adkins and



I have been working together since 2012 when my husband and I were starry eyed new foster parents with a desire to adopt a single, little girl. We met Lillian during our very first case when we were placed with two girls. Shortly after we were placed, we learned that the case was being extended six months, the girls had some challenges to overcome and we were new to everything. We navigated services, therapists, and a LOT of behaviors with Lillian by our side. She was always available to give us guidance and reassure us that we were making progress, even when it seemed like we weren't. Lillian went out of her way to accompany us to meet a little boy way out at Edward's Air Force base, on a holiday no less, to make sure that he was a good fit for our family. For those who are familiar with Lillian, no, she didn't drive. Then, Lillian talked us through our first big loss when, after a year, we said goodbye to our two girls which was really, really hard. Lillian then saw us through our adoption of our son in 2013. We were sure we still had the desire to adopt a girl, but we were still grieving our first long case. Lillian made sure we were emotionally prepared to continue. She even met with our older son to see how he was doing and help us be sure that continuing to foster would be the right thing for us as a family. When we saw other placements leave and were ready to quit, Lillian told us to keep going. She always encouraged my crazy love of networking and was just as excited as I was when I met a new DHS social worker who might remember me when it came time to place a new child. This year we adopted our daughter. It took a while but, like Lillian had promised, she is so, so worth the wait. Because we wanted to honor Lillian as part of our journey we named our daughter Jane Lillian. That is how much Lillian has meant to our family.

She received her BS at CSUB in Business Administration with a concentration in HR and a CCADAC Certificate from

Extended University CSUB. She was accepted into the MSW program at CSUB! Her life, education and work experience has enabled her to have the skills needed when dealing with her clients and foster parents. She is persevering and detail minded. Matilda is able to take away from her busy schedule to communicate to a troubled child or encourage an overwhelmed foster parent. She listens to a birth parent giving them every chance to improve their parenting skills. Thank you Matilda for being part of our team and for all you do.

Lillian is so much more than a social worker to her families. She is a mentor, a friend, a motivator and an incredibly funny, warm hearted person. Other foster parents had the following to say: Shawnda Banks said "She is always there when I need to talk, to cry, or to hold my hand and keep me sane (for the most part) on this crazy foster care journey. She is honest, straightforward and has so much empathy and compassion. That is truly unique for a social worker. I have not met anyone with her spunk, love and smiles as I have gone through this journey. We have cried many tears together." Jennifer Brians said "Without the support of Lillian we would have never been perfectly matched with our little family. She went above and beyond to make sure we had everything we needed. She is everything these kids and adoptive parents need to get through stuff in their case." I feel like it's not just a job for her and every case she has she can tell you, without looking at notes, what the kids names are, who they are placed with, their school, birth family history, she can even give a bit about their personality." You might notice a common theme from Lillian's foster families. "Goes above and beyond," and "always there." Lillian doesn't do these things because she has to do them, but truly because she wants to. She is just that kind of person. When she retires, I can say that the families she has worked with will miss her greatly. They won't stop calling her, but they'll miss her. Lillian, you will forever be one of the greatest influences of my life and I want you to know you are appreciated, admired and loved by those of us you have served. Thank you.

Sports Safety 101: Are AEDs Available during Practices and Games?

An Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is used to rescue a person suffering from cardiac arrest. It's an important tool to have on hand during practices and games if a child is not responsive, not breathing and does not have a pulse.

Below are some quick tips to help you locate an AED to ensure the proper equipment is available when your child is participating in sports.

Talk to your child's coach.

- Is he/she CPR and AED certified?
- If not, who is certified and present during practices and games?
- Where is the nearest AED available during home and away events?

Consider these action steps to help ensure an AED is available in your community.

- Contact field organizers/owners for information about the availability of AEDs.
- Encourage sports organizations to do research in advance of the season to schedule games and practices at locations that have an AED available.
- Work with your local Parks and Recreation department to learn their process for supplying AEDs.
- Contact foundations that donate or assist communities in getting access to AEDs.
- Raise funds (or request an increase in sports registration costs) to help your local youth sports organization purchase an AED. Most AEDs cost around \$2,200-\$4,000.
