Ongoing Trainings


Mark Dominguez will be offering the following trainings on an ongoing basis (participants must RSVP by the Thursday prior to the training to 661-865-2352):

Safety

Every household must have an Emergency Contact List, neatly written out or printed and available for view in a conspicuous area. This way, if a disaster strikes, family members or others can easily refer to it and contact emergency services or others if needed. Let your children know where they can find this list and how to use it in the event that they need to.

Main contact information should ideally be memorized (such as parents' phone numbers) but other family members' contacts like grandparents, aunts, and uncles in the immediate area can also be noted on this emergency contact list. In addition to family contacts, also include the phone numbers of local paramedics, fire departments, police stations, family doctors, and close friends to be extra prepared. It is recommended to have emergency numbers easily accessible in various places throughout your home.
