## FFA Resource Parents of the Year for 2023: Shana and Gale Doverspike

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Shana and Gale Doverspike are outstanding resource parents who are highly deserving of this recognition. Their journey in Foster Care started in 2009 when they adopted a sibling set of three. They thought they were finished with foster care. In 2019 they met 2 young boys through a family friend that needed to be placed together. After further investigation of the temporary home, they found out that there was another brother. They were certified again on June 14, 2019 and the three boys were placed in their home on July 12, 2019 after one month of weekend visits. On November 3, 2021, the adoption was finalized for two of the boys (the third boy did not want to be adopted at that time because he was still hoping that his mother would finish her case plan).

The Doverspike's have performed all of their resource parent duties and responsibilities in an outstanding manner. They are very loving, dedicated resource parents who have provided a wonderful home for the children who have been placed in their care. They treat every child as if they were their own and incorporate the child in every facet of their lives. They involve the children in numerous activities and family outings. Doverspike's live on a four-acre farm and the boys have been able to experience an array of activities ranging from feeding the animals to planting and harvesting gardens. The boys even received ponies for Christmas in 2021.

The Doverspike's never give a fourteen-day notice and they have the patience of Job. They never give up on a child, even after the child make three false allegations. I am happy to report that this child is making outstanding progress in the home and at school. This child has been recognized for the following awards: Honor Roll for Academics for second and third quarter, Outstanding Citizenship and Reading Award, Award for being a Math Super Star, All A's on music report card for playing the Cello, and Honor Orchestra, just to name a few.
