Are you ready for RFA?

If you are a KBYH foster parent, the answer to the above question is yes, because we are working hard to make sure our agency is ready for new foster care regulations and standards that go into effect 1/1/17. RFA stands for "Resource Family Approval" and refers to new requirements that apply to all foster families in the state of California. Beginning 1/1/17, foster families will no longer be called foster families. What will they be called, you ask? Resource Families. All foster caregivers, whether they are a relative, with the county, or with an FFA like ours, will be called Resource Families. Look for upcoming information and trainings from KBYH that will be provided to ensure you are familiar with what these changes entail.

Foster Family of the Month: The Brians/Mercier family



Last month a foster child, a teenager, was struck by a vehicle resulting in injuries. The child had traveled to a nearby Fast Mart to purchase a snack at night, against his caretaker's advice. While returning home on his scooter on a road which was not well lighted, he was struck in the back by a moving vehicle. The child was taken to the hospital, treated for moderate injuries and released. Risks become greater when one is unprotected, lighting is limited, improper clothing or attire is worn, and attention is not paid to one's safety.

Please:

- 1. Avoid traveling at night.
- 2. Avoid areas at night which are not well lit.
- 3. Wear lightly colored or reflective clothing/attire at night
- 4. Use flashlights or safety lighting at night
- 5. Be always alert and be aware of surroundings
- 6. Be Safe!!!
