



#### **Book Recommendations**

I am definitely a book-a-holic. I can't resist any book about women in the military or B-25 books. If you have any book recommendations, send them to us for a future newsletter.

The book, Spitfires, by Becky Aikman is about the 25 American women who flew with the British Air Transport Auxiliary. Excerpt from the inside cover of the book - "They were crop dusters and debutantes, college girls and performers in flying circuses – all of them trained as pilots. Because they were women, they were denied the opportunity to fly for their country when the United States entered the Second World War. But Great Britain desperately fighting for survival, would let anyone – even Americans, even women, transport warplanes. Thus, twenty-five daring young aviators bolted for England in 1942, becoming the first American women to command military aircraft."

The book, Nose Art of the 5<sup>th</sup> Air Force, is a rather expensive book at \$69.99 but to me it is worth the price. From the back cover "This massive volume includes more than 1,150 vintage images of WWII aircraft nose art. ......The bulk of the photos are sourced from the author's private collection and are previously unpublished. Text accompanying the images includes combat histories of specific aircraft and crews, along with biographical information on prolific artists."
