




Restoration Progress

The back wall of the lower turret is progressing quickly. The team is getting faster at fabricating the lower area of GF2. The picture below shows the bottom section of the rear wall prior to being riveted together. It takes a lot of clecos to hold the metal in place for riveting. The next picture shows the lower section placed in GF2. The brace to attach the sections needs to be fabricated then riveting will begin!

Work has begun on the cockpit windows. The windows operated on a track and sliding rods. The window was operated by squeezing the "clam shell" handles to release the rods to slide open or closed along the rod. The pictures below show the "clam shell" spring from the B-25, Hot Gen, located at the Canadian Warplane Heritage Museum. .





The picture below shows the fabricated handles for operating the windows. Many times a template is made from wood prior to making the metal parts.



The picture below shows the metal rods for operating the windows. This consists of a solid rod and a hollow tube.



Trailer Progress

The progress on the trailer is moving along well. The lights are attached and working. The fenders and tailgate are welded in place. If you look closely, you can see the black mount for the large scale B-25 in the middle of the trailer bed. The trailer will be used for advertising SCHAF in parades and other events.
