This first picture was taken while lying in the bombardier tunnel looking forward. It is amazing to be able to see the same view as the crew would have while crawling around the plane. We need to photoshop this picture to add sky and other B-25's while looking out rather than the door of the hangar! The other pictures show the ammo box on one side and shell bag on the other side of the machine gun. The detail in the ejection chute and ammo box are amazing. And a big shout out to Ron's wife, Linda, for making the bag for the shells. The profile of GF2 is beautiful with the glass, machine gun and new ammo box. If you look closely, you can see spent shells strewn around the floor of the bombardier area.
