<u>Tom Paul</u>, President Elect introduced his program of the week, <u>Brian</u> <u>Brett</u>, Chelan County #1 Fire Chief & Douglas County #2 manager.

Wenatchee Valley's two fire districts are expected to be run by the same chief over the next year while they explore the feasibility of a merger. During that period of time <u>Captain Brian Brett</u> will manage both fire districts.

Chelan County Fire District #1 has a new main station at in731 N. Wenatchee Avenue. This new station cost was \$6.8 Million. This fire service responds to thousands of calls of which 70% are medical like car accidents and heart attacks. The other 30% are fire and water rescues.

Interesting Fact About Fire Service

On December 7, 1736 Benjamin Franklin co-founded the Union Fire Company, also known as the "Bucket Brigade". It was the first formally organized all volunteer fire company in the colonies and was shaped after Boston's Mutual Fire Societies.

Besides responding to fires, auto accidents and medical emergencies such as heart attacks, the fire service does property inspections and they do water rescues.

The district is giving away free leaf bags to help reduce wildfire risk this summer. Brian brought some of those bags for us. Additional bags can be picked up the fire station (731 N. Wenatchee Ave.) M-F 8:00am - 5:00pm.
