Summertime projects for kids


Summer slide is a concept that has been on educators' minds since 1996, when the first comprehensive study on the topic was published. Students lose significant knowledge in core subjects over the summer break, and those losses increase each year. There's much parents can do to help their children continue learning over the summer. Educational projects may be a good start. Here's a brief list of educational projects children can work on this summer.

- ~ Conduct informal science experiments, such as growing the biggest vegetable or studying butterflies or insects that visit the backyard.
- Maintain a journal about adventures during summer vacation through personal narratives or even through creative fictional accounts based on the child's experiences.
 Search for patterns in nature, such as those in shells or flowers.
- ~ Learn about money by keeping tallies on souvenir purchases or the cost of items in stores.
- ~ Calculate distances from home by using maps and mileage.

- ~Become amateur meteorologists, keeping track of changing weather patterns and which signs indicate precipitation.
- ~Stock up on summer reading books that everyone in the family can enjoy while sitting poolside or at the beach.
- ~ Visit a museum or a local point of interest and learn about something historical.



~ There are three types of UV rays. UVA reaches Earth's surface because the atmosphere does little to shield these rays. UVA rays contribute to ailments like wrinkling and can penetrate through windows and clouds. UVB rays largely are thwarted by the atmosphere. However, latitude, altitude and time of year may increase the likelihood of UVB ray exposure, which is often the culprit behind skin cancer. UVC rays are completely absorbed by the Earth's atmosphere and don't pose a significant threat, even though they have the highest energy levels of all three types of UV rays.

~ The sun's UV rays are strongest between 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., when the sun is at its highest in the sky. The ultraviolet radiation will be less severe early in the morning and later in the day.

 \sim Snow, water and sand reflect the damaging rays from the sun and can increase a person's risk for sunburn.

 \sim The higher up in altitude a person goes, the stronger the sun's rays become. Therefore, sun exposure in the mountains can be more dangerous than exposure at sea level.

~ Areas closest to the equator will get the longest hours of sunlight. The sun's rays are much stronger near the equator.

~ Australia ranks near the top of the skin cancer risk list along with New Zealand. These countries are located close to the ozone layer hole over the Antarctic. In addition, during summer, the Earth's orbit places Australia closer to the sun compared to other countries. That results in an additional solar UV intensity, according to Specialist Clinics of Australia.

~ UVA rays penetrate more deeply into the skin and can cause it to prematurely age.

~ UVB rays damage the outermost layers of the skin and contribute to the most skin cancers. Overexposure to UVB rays causes delayed sunburns.

~ While the sun is more intense during spring and summer, sun glare may be a bigger problem in the fall and winter. The sun during the colder months takes a lower angled route when rising, rather than seemingly going straight up, which it does in the summer. That keeps the sun in a blinding position for a longer period of time in the fall and winter.

~ The sun's energy is produced by the fusion of hydrogen into helium. Nuclear reactions occur in the core of the sun due to temperature and pressure. The sun also emits infrared radiation, visible light and ultraviolet light



- History In June

June 1st 1880 The first pay telephone service in the United States is installed in New Haven, Connecticut.

June 10th 1639 1st American log cabin at Fort Christina (Wilmington Delaware).

June 11th 1184 BC Trojan War: Troy is sacked and burned, according to calculations by Eratosthenes. **June 12th 1835** Roof collapse kills 30 at murder trial in France.

June 13th 1866 US House of representatives passes 14th Amendment (Civil rights).

June 14th 1940 Auschwitz concentration and extermination camp opens in Nazi controlled Poland with Polish POWs, later expanded to include civilian Jews and gypsies (approx. 3 million would die within its walls).

June 15th 1991 Climactic eruption of the Mount Pinatubo volcano in the Philippines, the second-largest volcanic eruption on Earth of the 20th century.

June 16th 1884 1st roller coaster used (Coney Island NY).

June 17th 1631 Mumtaz Mahal dies during childbirth. Her husband, Mughal emperor Shah Jahan I, then spends more than 20 years building her tomb, the Taj Mahal.

June 18th 1928 American aviator Amelia Earhart becomes the 1st woman to fly across the Atlantic Ocean, landing at Burry Port, Wales.

June 19th 1865 Union General Gordon Granger declares slaves are free in Texas, now the date the end of slavery is celebrated across the US as Juneteenth.

June 20th 1782 Congress approves Great Seal of the United States of America with the bald eagle as its symbol.

June 21st 1788 US Constitution comes into effect when New Hampshire is the 9th state to ratify it.

June 22nd 1683 Galileo Galilei forced to recant his Copernican views that the Earth orbits the Sun
by the Pope (Vatican only admits it was wrong on Oct 31, 1992!).

June 23rd 1888 Frederick Douglass is 1st African-American to be nominated for US Vice President.

June 24th 1901 1st exhibition by Pablo Picasso aged 19, opens in Paris.



The basics of container gardening

Gardening is a rewarding hobby that has been linked to health benefits like reduced stress and improved mental well-being. Gardening also can lead to an inviting home landscape full of attractive blooms and/or delicious foods. Backyard gardens have long been planted after clearing a plot of land, tilling and amending the soil, and planting rows of favorite crops. However, gardening can be less labor-intensive and even more successful when people consider the many benefits of container gardening.

What is container gardening?

As its name implies, container gardening is growing plants inside of containers. These containers can be flower pots, rectangular deck boxes or even large raised garden beds.

Pros to container gardening

One of the advantages of container gardening is that plants can be moved in and out of sunlight to ensure the right growing conditions. This isn't as easily achieved when gardens are stationary. Also, beginner gardeners may be more able to control soil conditions inside of a small container rather than a vast ground-based garden, which will require a good deal of manual labor. Pots and boxes also can be grouped together to create eye-popping displays, usually at lower costs

than the sheer volume of plants that would be needed to fill out an expansive landscape.

Cons to container gardening

Container garden plants will not have direct access to the ground, so they need gardeners to create the ideal growing conditions. Developing the right care formula can be challenging. The home and garden resource The Spruce says that drainage is an important factor in container gardening, and most containers do not offer enough drainage holes. If water cannot escape the soil, the roots of the plants can rot and die. It's not enough to add stones or gravel to the bottom of containers. Drill additional holes in the bottom (1/2-inch in diameter for small or medium-sized pots; one inch in diameter for larger pots). Also, be sure to check on soil moisture so that watering can be adjusted. During hot stretches, plants may need to be watered more frequently.

Plan for plants that play well

Grouping plants together can create visually stunning combinations. However, it is important to choose plants that require the same amount of light and moisture. Look at plant tags when visiting the garden center and select complementary plants, or ask a store employee. Mixing different plant shapes, colors and leaf textures, as well as plants of various heights, can help containers look filled out,

Feed plants accordingly

Plants need nutrition to thrive in containers. Quality potting mixes will contain fertilizers, but nutrition will wane over time. Every couple of weeks, container plants will need either fresh potting mix or granular fertilizer added to feed them. Oregon State University Extension Services suggests using a slow-release fertilizer or worm castings several times throughout the season.

Container gardening is a great way to add plants to smaller patios, reduce the workload involved in maintaining expansive gardens, and customize conditions for optimal growth.

DRY AGED SMOKED OSSO BUCO TACOS

Ingredients:

2.5 lbs of osso buco

2 tablespoons of all purpose seasoning

2 tablespoons of beef base combined with 2 cups of water

1 onion

3 cloves of garlic

Taco shells (soft or hard depending on preference)

Shredded cheese

Diced tomatoes

Shredded lettuce

Sour cream

Instructions:

Step 1: After you've seasoned the meat, set up your smoker to cook at 250 degrees. When the smoker has gotten up to temp, put the meat in and let it cook until the internal temperature is 160 degrees (roughly about 3 hours).

Step 2: When the meat has finished, pull it from the smoker and place in a small aluminum foil pan with the beef broth, onion, and garlic. Cover the pan tightly with foil and braise the dry aged beef for another 2 hours on the smoker, until final internal temperature is 210.

Step 3: After the meat has rested, shred it. You can use two forks, the meat will fall apart easily. Remove any tough pieces of meat.

Step 4: Assemble your shredded beef on your taco shells! We added cheese, lettuce, pico, sour cream, and hot sauce.

Protect pets in hot weather

Warm weather brings many changes. Warm weather can make travel more enjoyable and affords people more time to comfortably enjoy the great outdoors. It's best to keep safety in mind when soaking up the sun. That's important for all members of the family, including pets. Cats and dogs are as susceptible to heat-related illnesses as their human companions.

Recognize heat stroke

Pets can suffer from heat stroke, according to the American Red Cross. Certain breeds of dogs are highly susceptible, particularly those with short snouts, such as pugs and bulldogs. Excessive exercise in hot weather, lack of appropriate shelter outdoors and leaving a dog in a hot car may precipitate an episode of heat stroke. It's important to get the pet out of direct heat right away and check for signs of shock, which include seizures, a body temperature of IO4 F or higher, stupor, increased heart rate, or excessive panting. Placing water-soaked towels on the pet's feet, head, neck, and abdomen can bring down its temperature.

Be cautious of hot surfaces

Humans wear shoes on their feet for protection, but pets do not have that luxury. Think about how hot your feet can feel when you scurry barefoot across hot sand en route to the shoreline or to cross a deck to get to the pool. When the sun beats down on surfaces, those surface temperatures rise quickly. According to a 2010 study by Liberty Home and Pet Services, at peak afternoon sun and an ambient temperature of 95 F in southern Florida, the temperature of cement was measured at 125 F, red brick at 135 F, blacktop at 140 F, and grass at 102 F. Individuals who think a car is safer for their dog or cat may be surprised the informal study measured 152 F on seat surfaces.

Provide extra water

It's likely you will need to fill your pets' water bowls more frequently in warm weather than during other times of the year. Be sure to provide constant access to fresh water, even for young puppies who may be learning to house train.

Avoid cutting fur too short

If a veterinarian suggests a hair cut may be beneficial for keeping a pet cool or comfortable, resist the urge to shave down to the skin. Having at least one inch of fur will protect the pet from sunburn.

Outdoor hazards

Warm weather may bring out a high number of insects and wildlife. Use a flea and tick preventative product and medication to protect against heartworm, which is transmitted through mosquitoes. Snakes, skunks, raccoons, foxes, and other animals may be roaming around, and a scuffle with your pet can result in injury.

Pets need extra care during the warm weather to avoid damage and sickness from the sun, heat and more.
