CELEBRATE THANKSGIVING WITH FOODS FROM THE FIRST FEAST

Thanksgiving is celebrated each November in the United States and each October in Canada. People traditionally gather around the dinner table flanked by friends and extended members of their families to give thanks for the blessings they enjoyed throughout the year as they dig into a delicious feast.

Turkey is typically the centerpiece of the Thanksgiving meal. Although turkey can be a delicious and nutritious addition to the table, individuals looking to expand their culinary horizons may want to borrow from the other foods believed to have been shared among the Plymouth Colony Pilgrims and Wampanoag natives during the 1621 feast that inspired Thanksgiving.

WATERFOWL

Wild turkey were available in abundance in the New World, but historians believe that, during the first Thanksgiving meal, participants likely feasted on waterfowl instead of turkey. In fact, turkey wasn't common Thanksgiving fare until after 1800. Waterfowl, according to National Geographic, includes ducks, mallards, swans, and geese. Those looking to experiment can take a break from turkey and make duck the centerpiece of their meals this Thanksgiving.

SEAFOOD

Plymouth, Massachusetts, is located where Cape Cod Bay and the Atlantic Ocean meet. As a result, indigenous people and the pilgrims likely relied on the bounties afforded by the ocean for their sustenance. Documentation of the first Thanksgiving by pilgrim chronicler Edward Winslow indicates lobster, fish and clams were likely served. People who enjoy seafood or those who prefer to abstain from meat or poultry can embrace seafood at their Thanksgiving gathering.

FRUITS AND VEGETABLES

Fruits native to the region where the first Thanksgiving took place included blueberries, plums, grapes, gooseberries, raspberries, and cranberries. Cranberry sauce was an unlikely menu option because sugar that traveled over on the Mayflower was probably depleted by November 1621, according to History.com. Also, cooks didn't begin boiling cranberries with sugar until about 50 years later. To recreate the first Thanksgiving, enjoy raw fruit as a tasty dessert, which can be healthier than sugar-laden sauces.

Vegetables to enjoy include onions, beans, spinach, cabbage, carrots, and corn. Corn was likely turned into cornmeal and pounded into a thick corn porridge. Experimenting with a cornmeal recipe can liven up this year's festivities.

TURNIPS

Plant roots found in 1621 included parsnips and turnips, and not the popular potatoes that often accompany turkey at modern Thanksgiving gatherings. The potato was not yet popular enough among the English to warrant space on the Mayflower as it made its way to present-day North America. Purees of parsnips and turnips can be delectable on their own or used as a basis for a Thanksgiving soup.

PUMPKIN CUSTARD

Although pumpkins and other gourds were available in the New World, baking was not yet popularized because of the lack of wheat flour. Instead, it is possible pilgrims would hollow out gourds, add spices with milk and honey, and then roll the gourds in hot flames to form a sort of custard. Home cooks can replicate a pumpkin custard in their kitchens and serve it in lieu of pumpkin pie.

Borrowing foods from the first Thanksgiving can expand menu possibilities this November.

- Check the forecast before you go. Weather can be unpredictable around Thanksgiving. Conditions may be sunny one day and then cold and icy the next. Stay up-to-date on the latest weather forecasts and road conditions as you prepare for your trip, making sensible decisions about traveling if there is inclement weather.
- Get your vehicle inspected. Have your vehicle inspected in the days before you hit the road. A mechanic's diagnostic checkup and routine servicing, such as topping off fluids and changing windshield wipers, can make driving safer.
- Keep your fuel tank more than half-full. FEMA suggests keeping the tank full when temperatures are extremely cold. This is because condensation can build up in near-empty gas tanks, potentially freezing fuel lines and leaving you stranded.
- Opt for airline updates. Flights can be delayed or canceled when weather is poor. Many airlines will now text travelers who are subscribed to updates or frequent-flyer programs and apps. That's a convenient and free bonus.
- Plan for stops. Drowsy driving and distracted driving are extreme dangers across North America. Take breaks to avoid drowsiness, and only use a mobile device when safely pulled over at a rest stop.
- Leave plenty of time. There are bound to be many travelers come Thanksgiving week. Build extra time into your trip so you don't have to speed or rush to make it on time.

Black Friday marks the unofficial start of the holiday shopping season. Come Black Friday, shoppers strive to get the lowest prices on gifts for their loved ones.

Much of the focus of Black Friday is on finding the best deals, but it can be interesting to take a breath and learn how this phenomenon developed and how it has evolved over the years.

"Black Friday"

The term "Black Friday" was originally associated with gold prices and manipulation on the part of speculators Jay Gould and James Fisk. This scandal occurred in September 1869. Commodity prices plummeted 50 percent as a result, and the term "Black Friday" was coined to refer to that drop.T

The phrase "Black Friday" also became famous for all the wrong reasons in 1966. Philadelphia police used it to refer to the Friday traffic jams and crowding in downtown stores from tourists and shoppers who flooded into the city in advance of the Army-Navy football game held the Saturday after Thanksgiving each year. Big-

ger crowds and rowdiness contributed to long hours and stressful shifts for local police.

Black Friday reinvented

The retail industry started using the term "Black Friday" in the late 1980s. Spin doctors turned previously negative connotations into positive ones by associating the phrase with stores turning a profit and moving accounting ledgers from "red to black" thanks to big year-end sales. Retailers and consumers rallied around low-cost "doorbusters" and other discounted prices.

Interestingly enough, according to the National Retail Federation (NRF), Black Friday really hasn't been the most lucrative day for retailers over the years. In fact, greater profits and larger crowds are often seen on the last Saturday preceding Christmas.

Shopping weekend evolves

While Black Friday may have been the catalyst, in recent years shoppers have made the entire weekend of Black Friday a lucrative one for retailers. Many stores are now open on Thanksgiving and extend sales through the entire weekend. Small Business Saturday and Sunday promote patronizing mom-and-pop stores. Cyber Monday emerged when online shopping became a popular way to grab deals, and it marks the close of the opening weekend of the holiday shopping season. In 2017, Black Friday weekend attracted 174 million shoppers who spent an average of \$335.47, according to the NRF.

HOW TO FIND BARGAINS ON



As Thanksgiving draws near, retailers begin dropping hints about their Black Friday promotions. Some stores have begun to open their doors on Thanksgiving evening, after many people have filled up on turkey and trimmings. Smart shoppers recognize that Black Friday is a great time to find deals on holiday gifts, and following these tips can help shoppers save even more.

- Begin researching early. Since many retailers begin posting information online or send out advertisements about sale items far in advance of Black Friday, shoppers should pay attention to each retailer's offerings so they can better coordinate their shopping efforts. Cross-reference prices against other stores, including both online retailers and traditional brick-and-mortar stores.

- Have discount codes at the ready. Many retailers now use digital apps or emails to keep in touch with customers. These same apps may enable smartphone users to search for discount codes and other coupons. Keep digital coupons handy so they can be presented quickly at checkout.

MANATEES SWIM INTO THE SPOTLIGHT



The month of November brings the onset of cooler weather, which in turn welcomes the arrival of hundreds of Citrus County's most influential animal – manatees. Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park gives visitors to the area a unique, up-close experience with these gentle giants year-round. Viewed from above the ground or below the water's surface, the park's three captive manatees serve as ambassadors for the species, the centerpiece of educational programs presented daily by park rangers and volunteers (at 11:30 AM, 1:30 PM, and 3:30 PM).

As part of the Manatee Rescue and Rehabilitation Partnership, Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park

also serves as a rehabilitation facility for injured manatees. Prior to their release back into the wild, the manatees in the park's care can get reacquainted with their natural environment in our fresh spring water. This year the park received multiple manatees due to red tide, all of which will return to their home waters once the red tide has cleared. Over the years many manatees have been successfully returned to the wild after their stay at the park, and it is for this and many other reasons that the park is celebrating these beloved creatures in the month of November.

WILDLIFE PARK TO HOST SAVE THE MANATEE CLUB MANATEE ADOPTION DAY ON SAT., NOV. 17

Ellie Schiller Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park will be hosting the Save the Manatee Club for a special Holiday Manatee Adoption Day on Saturday, November 17, 2018 from 10:00 am until 3:00 pm in the park's Visitor Center located on US 19. This event is part of the park's monthly focus for November on West Indian Manatees. By adopting a manatee, you will become a member of the Save the Manatee Club and can help this threatened species. You'll receive a certificate of adoption, the manatee's photo and biography, a membership handbook, the quarterly Manatee Zone newsletter with updates on your manatee and Paddle Tales, the club's e-newsletter. Memberships help fund manatee rescue and rehabilitation, education, public awareness projects, and conservation to protect manatees and their habitats. Manatee adoptions start at \$25/year for an individual or \$20/year for a school class. For more information on adopting a manatee, contact Save the Manatee Club at savethemanatee.org or by calling 1-800-432-5646, or visit the park on Saturday, November 17, 2018 to adopt a manatee.

CURRENT MANATEE HAPPENINGS

The Ellie Schiller Homosassa Springs Wildlife State Park is currently home to three resident manatees – Ariel, Electra, and Betsy. Unable to survive in the wild, these three female manatees delight visitors from around the world with their natural charm. Ariel has been a park resident since 1986 and enjoys peering into the Underwater Observatory at onlookers, often pressing her muzzle against the glass to the delight of those inside. Born in the wild, Electra was rescued due to injuries that caused her to have difficulty swimming. She arrived at the park in 2000 and can be identified by her misshapen flippers, a result of an injury she sustained in the wild. She is well recovered and enjoys quietly eating her lettuce in the shallow water. Born in the park in 1990, Betsy is the largest of our three manatees and is often seen checking out the male rescue manatees in the paddock areas.

The park currently has six rehabilitation manatees from SeaWorld Orlando, five males and one female. These manatees will be staying at the wildlife park until the areas where they will be released are deemed free of red tide.
