The origins of "The 12 Days of Christmas"

Christmas carols can be heard far and wide from Thanksgiving weekend through Christmas Day. "The 12 Days of Christmas" is one of the most recognizable carols, and for good reason, as the popular song can trace its history back several centuries. Researchers have traced the earliest printed version of the poem on which the song is based all the way back to 1780. That's three years before the signing of the Treaty of Paris, which officially ended the American Revolutionary War. The song has long been suspected to have been a way for Catholics in Britain to teach their children the catechism, as the 1700s was a controversial period for Catholicism in the country. However, no documentary evidence exists in support of that theory, and many historians feel it is inaccurate. Others indicate that, while 1780 is likely the first time the poem was printed, the poem is likely much older than that, with origins potentially in France or Scotland. What is known is that the version many people recognize today, namely in song form, can be traced to the early twentieth century, when English singer and composer Frederic Austin first popularized the melody for the song. Austin performed that version of the song beginning in 1905, and it was first published in 1909.



Pitfalls to avoid when making resolutions this year

Estimates vary depending on the year and scope of the study, but research into New Year's resolutions has generally found that fewer than 10 percent of people who make resolutions each year stay the course until they've accomplished their goal. In fact, a 2020 poll conducted by OnePoll in conjunction with Crispy Green found that the average person has abandoned his or her resolution by February 1. No two people are the same, but resolutions could fall victim to various pitfalls that can affect anyone. Recognition of these pitfalls when making a resolution may improve your chances of being successful in the year ahead.

~ Lack of specificity: When making a resolution, be as specific as possible. If you want to read more, resolve to read two books per month (or however many books you feel you can reasonably read in a month). If you want to lose weight, speak to your physician to help you set a specific weight loss goal you can meet without

compromising your overall health.

~ No measuring stick to track progress: Specificity is important, but it's not the only tool you can use to stay the course with a resolution. Maintain a resolution journal or blog that allows you to gauge your performance. This can help you engage more fully in your resolution efforts, providing an outlet you can use to explore your successess and failures. The more engaged you are in your resolution efforts, the more likely those efforts will prove successful.

~ Going it alone: The buddy system works when pursuing various goals, and New Year's resolutions are no exception. A friend or family member along for the resolution journey can make it easier to maintain your motivation. For example, anyone who wants to read more can join a book club, which can provide the motivation to finish books or excerpts before a weekly discussion.

~ Biting off more than you can chew: Small resolutions may not seem like much, but minor efforts can serve as the stepping stones to realizing larger goals. If your goals are too ambitious at the outset, you're more likely to give up at the first setback.

~ Not anticipating setbacks: Setbacks will happen, and as noted, it's easy to let them derail your efforts when they first appear. Recognize that there will be bumps in the road but that these

bumps should in no way end your journey. Take setbacks as the valuable lessons that they can be, and use them as an opportunity to examine what you did that didn't work and what you can do to avoid future setbacks.





Recycle and reduce waste for the holidays

The holiday season is a special time of year. Individuals often spend a little more on gifts, indulge a little more on rich foods and treats and make a concerted effort to enjoy more time with their loved ones during the holidays.

The tendency to overdo things during the holiday season can create a lot of waste. In fact, Americans produce 25 percent more garbage from Thanksgiving through the end of the year, according to Waste Advantage magazine, a publication of the waste and recycling industry. - ~ Buy durable and reusable items as gifts. Avoid fad gifts and focus on items that will have staying power. Homemade gifts, such as foods, knitted scarves, artwork, and more, are generally eco-friendly.
- ~ Set up marked trash and recycling receptacles. Remind party guests to recycle the appropriate materials by clearly marking a pail designed for collecting recyclables, such as cans, plastic beverage bottles and glass wine bottles. Most hard plastics can be recycled.
- Remove your name from catalog lists. Call companies and ask to be taken off promotional mailing lists to reduce paper waste.
- Send a photo. Mail holiday card recipients photos of the kids or the entire family in lieu of cards. They're apt to save the photos and display them, helping to keep even more paper trash out of landfills.
- ~ Research new recipes for leftovers. With an abundance of food remaining after entertaining, turn leftovers into new meals by exploring recipes from friends or by doing a little research online.

Waste can get out of control during the holidays, but there are ways to tame the excess.



Bacon makes pumpkin pie even better:

Pumpkin pie is a fall favorite, but it's also a perfect pie to serve throughout the holiday season.

There are many different pumpkin pie recipes, even though it's difficult to improve on pumpkin pie which is known for its creamy consistency and warm spices. But pumpkin pie can be even more delicious with the addition of an extra-special ingredient: bacon.

This recipe for "Joe's Incredible Bacon Pumpkin Pie," courtesy of Royal Bacon Society and Allrecipes, uses maple-cured bacon as well as tangy cream cheese to increase the appeal of pump-kin pie. This may be one slice of pie that is hard to put down.

Joe's Incredible Bacon Pumpkin Pie Serves 12

1/2	cup cubed fresh pumpkin
11/2	cups cream cheese, softened
1	cup packed brown sugar
3	eggs
3 1	teaspoon vanilla extract
1	cup half-and-half
1	teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/2	teaspoon ground ginger
1/2	teaspoon ground allspice
1/2	teaspoon ground cloves
2 16	(10-inch) prepared graham cracker pie crusts
16	slices maple-cured bacon

- 1. Preheat oven to 425 F.
- 2. Bring a small pot of salted water to a boil; add the pumpkin and cook until soft enough to easily pierce with a fork, about 10 minutes. Drain.
- 3. Mash the cooked pumpkin with a potato masher in your favorite large bowl. Mix the cream cheese and brown sugar with the mashed pumpkin. Whisk in the eggs one at a time. Add the vanilla, half-and-half, cinnamon, ginger, allspice and cloves; stir until you have a thin batter. The batter should be slightly thinner than pancake batter. Pour the batter into the pie crusts.
- 4. Place the bacon in a large skillet over medium heat until evenly brown. Trim soft, fatty bits from strips. Press seven pieces of bacon into the batter of each pie with a fork.
- 5. Bake the pies in the preheated oven for 15 minutes. Decrease the heat to 375 F. Top each pie with two pieces of ecooked bacon and bake.

A warm stew to chase the chill away

As the mercury dips and snow and ice making conditions outside less inviting, a warm and welcoming meal inside can be just what



to 8 minutes; transfer to a plate.

Add the flour and the remaining 2 tablespoons of oil to the pot and cook, stirring for 1 minute. Add the orange juice, tomatoes, garlic, jalapenos, and 4 cups water and bring to a boil. Return the pork to the pot, cover, transfer to oven, and cook until the pork is tender, 2 1/2 to 3 hours.

Skim off and discard any fat from the stew. Add the okra. Cover the pot, return it to the oven, and cook until the okra is tender, about 15 minutes. If the stew is too thin, place the pot on the stove and simmer, uncovered, until thickened, 5 to 10 minutes more. Meanwhile, cook the grits according to the package directions. Serve with the stew and marinated onions.

Classic fruitcake tailor-made for the holiday season

Though it might not have as many devotees as holiday cookies, fruitcake is a must-have for many during the holiday season. This recipe for "Fruitcake" from Jeanne Sauvage's "Gluten-Free Baking For the Holidays" (Chronicle Books) can help holiday celebrants ensure the holiday tradition of baking fruitcake continues this holiday season.

Fruitcake (Serves 10 to 15)

Macerated Fruit

21/2 pounds raisins, pitted prunes, pitted dates, and dried figs, finely chopped

1/2 cup candied orange and/or lemon peel, finely chopped

cup candied or dried cherries, finely chopped 1/3 2/3 cup candied or preserved ginger, finely chopped

Grated zest and juice of 1 large lemon **Grated zest and juice of 1 large orange**

tablespoon orange or tangerine marmalade

tablespoon apricot jam

cup applesauce

tablespoons brandy, sweet sherry or apple juice

cup unsalted butter, at room temperature, plus more for greasing

cups Jeanne's Gluten-Free All-Purpose Flour (see below)

teaspoon ground cinnamon teaspoon ground ginger

teaspoon freshly grated nutmeg

teaspoon ground allspice

tablespoon baking powder

cup packed dark brown sugar

teaspoon pure vanilla extract

extra-large eggs, at room temperature

tablespoons brandy, rum, whiskey, sweet sherry, or apple juice, or as needed



The day before you bake the cake, prepare the macerated fruit. Place the raisins, prunes, dates, and figs in a large bowl. Add the citrus peel, cherries, ginger, lemon zest and juice, and orange zest and juice. Add the marmalade, jam, applesauce, and brandy and stir to combine. Cover the bowl and let stand overnight at room temperature so that the fruits soak up the liquid and the flavors meld. The mixture can macerate in the refrigerator for up to 1 week.

Preheat the oven to 325 F. If the fruit has been in the refrigerator, bring it to room temperature. Grease the bottom and sides of a 91/2- or 10-inch springform pan with butter. Line the bottom with three layers of parchment paper and the sides with one layer of parchment. The batter will be very sticky.

In a medium bowl, mix together the flour, cinnamon, ginger, nutmeg, allspice, and baking powder.

In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, beat the butter on medium-high speed until light and fluffy, about 3 minutes. Add the brown sugar and beat for 1 minute. Reduce the speed to low, add the vanilla, and beat until combined. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating after each addition. Then beat for 1 minute longer. Add the flour mixture and beat until just combined. Add the macerated fruit and, with a large wooden spoon, combine with the batter. This requires a bit of strength. Scrape the batter into the prepared pan.

Bake for 2 hours, then reduce the oven temperature to 300 F and bake until a toothpick inserted into the middle of the cake comes out clean, about 2 hours. If the cake browns too quickly, you might want to tent it with aluminum foil for the last 2 hours so it doesn't burn.

Remove the cake from the oven and, while it is still hot, pierce it all over with a skewer. Pour the brandy over the top. Place the pan on a wire rack and let the cake cool completely.

Remove the sides from the pan and peel the parchment paper from the sides and bottom of the cake. Wrap the cake in waxed paper and place it in an airtight container or wrap it in a few layers of plastic wrap. Leave the cake at room temperature for 3 to 5 days to allow the flavors to meld. If you used alcohol, you may store the cake in the refrigerator for up to 2 weeks. Once the cake is sliced, store in an airtight container at room temperature for up to 1 week.

Jeanne's Gluten-Free All-Purpose Flour (Makes 4 1/2 cups)

11/4 cups brown rice flour 11/4 cups white rice flour cup sweet rice flour cup tapioca flour Scant 2 teaspoons xanthan gum

In a large bowl, whisk together the brown and white rice flours, sweet rice flour, tapioca flour, and xanthan gum thoroughly. Transfer the mix to an airtight container. Store in a cool, dark place for up to 6 weeks or in the refrigerator for up to 4 months.





How to find more time for leisure



Calendars may be used most often for work, but they also can be useful when trying to schedule time for leisure. Blocking off certain hours of the day to pursue leisure activities ensures open hours on a schedule won't be filled by impromptu meetings with coworkers or other events that can take away from time to rest and relax.

~ Minimize distractions during the workday. Workdays can be hectic, but many professionals succumb to distractions like the internet, text messaging with friends or family or scanning social media during a typical workday. In fact, a 2019 study by Rescue Time found that workers average just two hours and 28 minutes of productive time each workday. Increasing productivity by blocking out distractions during the workday should help professionals get more done during the workday, which in turn should free up time for leisure activities.

~ Make the most of a remote or hybrid working arrangement. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, many businesses were forced to shift to remote working, and many have maintained that standard or adopted a hybrid working option. Numerous studies have shown that workers' productivity increases when they shift to remote work. However, it's important that individuals who work from home recognize they must walk a tightrope in order to make hybrid or remote working beneficial for their pursuit of more leisure time. Research from Ergotron found that 40 percent of workers work longer hours at home than in the office. Though remote or hybrid work can create more space for leisure time, it's only effective when workers make an effort to log off when the typical workday ends. In such instances, time normally spent commuting can be designated for recreational pursuits.



Signs of anxiety in dogs

 Mental health issues have garnered some much-needed attention in recent years. As the world confronted a global pandemic, the mental health cost of that confrontation proved significant, prompting millions of people to speak openly about mental health for the first time. Much of the conversation surrounding mental health conditions in recent years has focused on the human toll those conditions have taken. But mental health issues, including anxiety, can affect pets as well. According to the American Kennel Club, dog anxiety can affect all breeds. •As a result, it behooves all dog owners to learn about dog anxiety so they can be in the best position possible to help their furry friends. •What is anxiety?

The anxiety dogs feel is not much different than that felt by humans. Merriam-Webster defines anxiety as "apprehensive uneasiness or nervousness over an impending or anticipated ill." Although the AKC acknowledges that all dogs feel anxiety at one point or another, the organization warns that disproportionate levels of anxiety that go untreated can produce an anxiety disorder in dogs. Such disorders can pave the way to behavioral and other issues.

•What causes anxiety in dogs?

The Merck Veterinary Manual indicates that fear, separation and aging are some of the most common causes of dog anxiety. Some dog owners may recognize that their dogs are fearful of loud noises, strangers (including both people and animals they don't recognize), eveterinary visits, and certain visual stimuli. Though that fear is often temporary, it could lead to significant anxiety in some dogs. The AKC estimates that around 14 percent of dogs are affected by separation anxiety. These dogs cannot be comfortable when •their owners leave, and they may engage in various negative behaviors as a result. Such behaviors include chewing or destroying furniture, urinating or defecating in the home even if they've been trained, and excessive barking.

Age-related anxiety has been linked to cognitive dysfunction syndrome, or CDS. In such instances, dogs with CDS experience anxiety as they deal with issues affecting their memory, perception and awareness.

What are some symptoms of anxiety in dogs?

The AKC advises dog owners to be on the lookout for these important symptoms of dog anxiety:

- Aggression
- •~ Urinating or defecating in the house
- Drooling
- ~ Panting
- ~ Destructive behavior
- ~ Depression
- Excessive barking
- Pacing
- ~ Restlessness
- ~ Repetitive or compulsive behaviors

Anxiety can be a serious issue for dogs that adversely affects their quality of life. Various approaches can be tried to treat dogs with anxiety. Dog owners who suspect their dogs are experiencing excessive anxiety are urged to discuss their concerns with their • veterinarians.
