My Latin Heart is a piece for marching band that is based on *Marcha de Zacatecas*, the well-known march from Mexican composer Genaro Codina. It lovingly merges the Cuban Mambo and the Mexican traditions. The percussion “Accessories” are all-important in this arrangement. At bar 92 the entire band should give out big verbal “ugh!” in the tradition of Pérez Prado. And don’t be shy about the low brass octaves that punctuate certain phrase endings such as at bars 37, 56 and 84. The 1st trumpet part is divided so that those trumpet players that can handle the higher parts should play them and those that aren’t ready for the highest notes can and should play the bottom note of the divisi. It is my hope that this piece will be a fun alternative to the marching repertoire (and concert repertoire for the more adventuresome) and inspire young musicians to achieve their best in music.
