Lock Keepers Action. On Tuesday the EA received notice of the lock keepers' intent to take 'action short of a strike' from 6pm on Tuesday 17 June through to 9am on Wednesday 2 July. This will consist of no voluntary overtime or use of personal vehicles. There may be some disruption to service during this time which could impact on partners and customers. The main risks are related to water level management, water abstraction and navigation outside of lock and weir keepers' normal working hours.

Rowers Walkout. Britain's most prestigious rowing club – the home of many legendary Olympians - has been accused of ignoring the safety fears of its own female rowers, leading them to refuse to train with their male teammates. ITV News has learned of two investigations carried out by the Leander Club, both involving allegations against two of its male athletes. One was accused of a serious sexual assault in 2022, the other was investigated for harassment last year. The alleged victims were female rowers at Leander. Both men deny the allegations. The fall-out at the club, which takes on 20 to 30 new athletes every year as members and boasts a host of Olympic champions as alumni, became so toxic that last season female rowers staged a walkout.

CRT Change. The Canal and River Trust have announced that Campbell Robb will be appointed the new CE as from Oct. He will be replacing Richard Parry who has been in

post since 2013 and earns circa £214,155 (no wonder the CRT are short of money).
