NOT SO FAST

During the season of Lent, many people ask questions about fasting. You often hear, "What are you giving up for Lent?" Here are a few thoughts on this topic. First, what does it mean to fast? Is it merely giving something up, or is there more to it?

Fasting deals with food. Eating plays a prominent role in the Bible from Genesis to Revelation. Sin came into the world by eating the forbidden fruit and in the end God will bid us to reach out and eat from the tree of life.

The children of Israel needed food in the wilderness and God supplied it. Jesus fed

the 5000 and 4000 with a meager amount which he multiplied. The whole point of food in the Bible is that our God will provide for us and satisfy our needs. Therefore, when we fast it's actually something dealing with food.

You've probably seen things on social media posts, suggesting that rather than miss a meal, to fast from other things.
Cursing, hatred, evil thoughts, things of this nature. That's fine, but shouldn't we be shunning those things all the time?

True fasting is about the knowledge that God has provided for us through his own suffering. In this, we fast to show him our trust and thankfulness in his gracious gifts. Therefore, the proper understanding of (continued on next page)

fasting is to replace a physical meal with a spiritual one. What I mean is sitting down at the table and rather than eating food, feed your soul with God's holy word.

There are many reasons for fasting throughout scripture. For example, Psalm 69:10 says, "When I wept and humbled my soul with fasting, it became my reproach." Here it's seen as a sign of humility. In Joel 2:12 we read, "Yet even now," declares the Lord, "return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning." Here it's associated with repentance. Fasting is always done with the idea of being drawn closer to God.

Therefore, what rules might we want to observe? Number one, don't make it a Law you must follow. Fasting should be done from the heart and not as a means of seeking merit. Second, don't attempt to do more than you're able to. Fasting is not a competition but rather something between you and God. Third, remember you are not required to fast. "For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, not a result of works, so that no one may boast." (Ephesians 2:8—9).

Have a very blessed Lenten Season as we look forward to celebrating Easter. In the death and Resurrection of Jesus Christ, you have the assurance of salvation and eternal life in his name. Amen.
