## AS PASSED SENATE

## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

- 1 To amend Chapter 80 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to
- 2 general provisions relative to counties, municipal corporations, and other governmental
- 3 entities, so as to prohibit the regulation of businesses of persons under 18 years of age; to
- 4 provide for a short title; to provide for definitions; to provide for related matters; to provide
- 5 for an effective date; to repeal conflicting laws; and for other purposes.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

- 7 SECTION 1.
- 8 Chapter 80 of Title 36 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to general
- 9 provisions relative to counties, municipal corporations, and other governmental entities, is
- amended by adding a new Code section to read as follows:
- 11 "36-80-29.
- 12 (a) This Code section shall be known and may be cited as the 'Georgia Lemonade Stand
- 13 Act.'

- 14 (b) As used in this Code section, the term:
- 15 (1) 'Business' means any enterprise carried on for the purpose of gain or economic profit.

- 16 (2) 'Gross receipts' means all receipts from whatever sources derived before any
- deductions and does not include tips, gratuities, or other amounts customarily assumed
- to be intended for the person who has served the customer or client.
- 19 (c) A county, municipal corporation, or other governmental entity shall not require a
- 20 <u>license</u>, permit, or any other form of regulation for a business that:
- 21 (1) Is operated solely by a person or persons under 18 years of age;
- 22 (2) Is located on private property with the permission of the property owner;
- 23 (3) Generates gross receipts of \$5,000.00 or less in a calendar year; and
- 24 (4) Sells nonconsumable goods or prepackaged foods or lemonade or other
- 25 <u>nonpotentially hazardous nonalcoholic beverages."</u>
- 26 SECTION 2.
- 27 This Act shall become effective upon its approval by the Governor or upon its becoming law
- 28 without such approval.
- SECTION 3.
- 30 All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
